The Capital City Broadcasting Co., has been granted application for a new station at Lansing, Mich. to operate on 1210 kycs unlimited time; KGIR has been granted application for modification of license changing frequency from 1360 kycs to 1340 kycs; KFPY in Spokane has been granted modification of license to change frequency from 1340 kycs to 890 kycs; Mr. H. Felte was denied his application for a new station on 1310 kycs at Meriden, Minn. Application of Herman Rader was denied for a new station in Lansing, Mich to operate on 1210 kycs. also the application of State Journal was denied for a new station in Lansing, Mich to operate on 1210 kycs.
