We also received a notice from the FCC which we thought might be of interest to you. They have advised us that there were 41,555 valid imatuer station licenses in existence of record July 1, 1933. Issued during fiscal year, new and renewed 8,790 making a total of 50,345 . Less cancellation's 3,777; Other deletions, due to death, etc. 153 and revocations 25 leaving a total of 46,390 valid stations of record close of June 30, 1934.
