It is our hope that all of you that failed to hear TGW Sunday before last, were up to try for them this past Sunday morning, for we were surprised to hear them coming in better this past Sunday morning than they did the first Sunday that we heard them. We do not know just how much longer they plan to run these Sunday morning broadcasts but we are certain that if they continue with them that they should easily be heard by all of our members, for they certainly do come into headquarters with a lot of volume. No doubt they are using their 10 KW transmitter and it is for this reason that they come in here so fine. As late as 5:45 A.M., E.S.T. this past Sunday morning they were still coming in mighty fine. We would advise all of you to get right on the job after them, for we are certain that you will hear them without any difficulty if these programs continue.

We here at headquarters were certainly surprised on Tuesday morning, September 25 when we were listening to a station on 1200 kycs, and heard them announce that the station was KADA Ada. Okla. We had no idea that this station would be on the air for some time yet, we certainly must give them credit for getting on the air in quick order after having received their Construction Permit. We do not know whether they will continue to test very long or not, but we would advise you to watch closely for them during the next week or so.

Those of you that have not yet heard WHEF, 1500 kycs. Rosciusko, Miss. are advised to watch for them in the early mornings also, for they have been running quite a few dx programs between 1:00 and 3:00 A.M. lately. However we suppose that they will be on the frequency tests in October too, for now that their transmitter is on the air, they no doubt will have to take part in the after mid-night tests as is required by the Federal Communications Commission.

Let us again call your attention to the fact that KWYO 1370 Kycs. Sheridan, Wyo. will take part in these tests the first Friday of each month. We know that there are many of our members that still need Wyoming to complete their state roster and we would advise you to watch for them if that is the case. Several of our members were fortunate enough to hear them last month during their test and they say that they come in very strong and clear.
