Well now that the York Fair is over and the World Series nearly over, perhaps ye editor can again put his full attention to these Bulletins, in hopes that he may be able to give you a lot of interesting information at all times.

Joe Becker, Sr. the very capable Vice-President of our club sends us some very good news this week in the form of an acceptance for a DX program over HIX, Santo Domingo, Dom. Rep. for the morning of January 6, 1935 from 3:10 to 5:10 A.M., E.S.T. They have further specified that this program is to be dedicated to the members of our club and advise us that the broadcast will be transmitted simultaneously on 6,000 kilocycles and 1270 kilocycles. They also urge that our members should honestly specify which frequency they heard them using when they report this broadcast. We don't need to again urge you to send in as many reports on this broadcast as you possibly can, for we are confident that by this time you know that it is our policy to ask you to send in as many reports as you can in appreciation for the fine DX programs that the various stations have been presenting for the members of our club and we know that you will all show HIX your appreciation by sending in a fine report on the broadcast. We want to constratulate Joe upon his fine efforts in securing this special broadcast for the National Radio Club.

We are also in receipt of a fine letter from Mr. T. R. Grosvenor, President of the Mid-Co DX Exchange in which he advises us that he is working on the DX schedule of KFH Wichita, Kansas, and which he expects to release in the very near future. He tells us that KFH runs these broadcasts the last Thursday morning of each month from 3:15 to 3:45 A.M., E.S.T. and that each of these programs is to be dedicated to some radio club and he will advise us just which is which as soon as the schedule is released. Mr. Grosvenor has to assist in putting on these broadcasts and he informs us that he has to walk from his home to the transmitter, a distance of about 40 blocks, he says that he is glad to do this but would appreciate a flood of reports in return for his efforts, on each DX broadcast. He says that all reports will be acknowledged without return postage, but return postage must be included when asking for a verification.

We wish to take this opportunity to thank all of the radio stations who so graciously dedicated their October frequency tests to the members of our club. We certainly appreciate their fine and splendid co-operation and we hope that we may be able to return this co-operation some day, you know our motto is to help the stations at any time in any manner we possibly can.

From Howard Schlobohm, our faithful Brooklyn CPCer we learn that the broadcast from WNRA Muscle Shoals, Ala. which our V.P. Joe Becker heard on September 30, was dedicated to the members of our club, un fortunately Joe did not hear that part of the program. Howard also cavises us that he has received a confirmation from WEED, Rocky Point, G. will run a DX program on Sunday morning, October 14 from 4:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. the first 15 minutes of which will be dedicated to the members of our club and the other 45 minutes to the CDXR. WEED operates on 1420 kycs. Don't forget to send in your reports on this broadcast. Thanks for the fine work, Howard, we all appreciate it very much.

We are not including the stations CFRC and CKCR on 1510, for the simple reason they have been eliminated long ago on their other frequencies.
