DX NEWS DECE BER 1, 1934.

This week we are off to a late start, hence we hope you will pardon the heading we are using on this week's Bulletin. We certainly hope th t you all had better luck this week with your DXing that we did here at headquarters. This turned out to be just about the poorest week we had this season so far.

KIT will be on the air from 5:30 to 6:00 A.M., E.S.T. The third special is from WAWZ 1350 kycs. Zarephath, N. J. This station will be on for our members from 6:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. Let's all send in our reports on all of these broadcasts and many thanks to Floyd for his fine efforts in securing these dedications for our members.

In our hurry last week we neglected to show CFQC Saskatoon in our DX Calander in their special for our club. However we had given you a write-up containing the particulars for this broadcast the week before.
