We want to call your attention to the fact that this month will end the big contest which has been sponsored by Bob Rawstron. Those of you that have not as yet sent in your results in this contest are urged to do so immediately. This contest you know involves the verifications and thank you cards and letters that you have sent to the various stations that put on DX programs for our club since December 15. Each verification received on one of our programs counts 3 points and each thank you card or letter counts 1 point. San Francisco, Calif. for Sunday morning, March 10 from 3:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. We understand that this program is also to be dedicated to CDXR. We hope that you'll all be listening in and send KFRC your reports. Thanks for this fine work, John!!!

We are also in receipt of a card from CFLG 930 kycs. Prescott, Ontario, who have advised us that they will put on a DX program for the members of our club from 3:30 to 4:00 A.M., on Sunday morning, March 10. This station will be taking part in the series of DX programs from Canadian stations known as "Canada On The Air." The full list of Canadians participating in this series of broadcasts is shown on page four of this week's Bulletin.

Don't forget the KFI DX program which is to be presented as another of the Four Star Specials arranged by Charles Hesterman. This program will also take place on Sunday morning, March 10 from 3:00 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. We want each and every one of you to be sure to listen to this broadcast and send in your reports. Then on Sunday morning, March 17 we

are to have another of the Four Star Specials arranged by Mr. Hesterman, from station WLW from 1:30 to 2:30 A.M., E.S.T. We do not know whether they will use 500 KW for this broadcast or not, but if they do, it will be the first time that NRC has had a program over such a powerful transmitter. Therefore we hope you will all listen to this broadcast and send in your reports on it too.

Incidentally did you know that WLW are only using 50 KW at night at the present time. The FCC have made them reduce their power at night owing to alleged interference that they had been causing in Canada. However the latest information has it that WLW are at work installing a directional antenna which will screen their signal from Canada and as soon as that move is completed they will return to using 500 KW at night.

We want to again urge you to keep your eyes open for Australians and New Zealanders, for our good friend Ray Lewis reports fine reception from them last week. We urge you to particularly watch 1YA 650 kycs. Auckland, N. Z. 2BL 855 kycs. Sydney, Aust. 4QG 760 kycs. Brisbane, Aust. and 4BC 1045 kycs. Brisbane, Aust. The best time to watch for them is any morning around 4:30 to 6:15 A.M., E.S.T. We are particularly sure that your efforts will be rewarded if you will just watch for 1YA, for this station is now using 10 KW and can be heard almost at will after 4:30 A.M. Keep your eyes open for them.

The Federal Communications Commission surely have been handing out a lot of Construction Permits lately, and we feel confident that most of the DXers are very well pleased with their actions, for this is going to mean a lot more new stations to try for in the next 9 months or a year as they begin to take the air. We shall try to keep you reliably informed as to just when each of these stations begin testing.

The WORK DX Club broadcast took the air at 8:15 P.M. last Friday evening instead of the regular 7:45 time owing to an Intercollegiate Debate which was heard from our station at that time. We hope however that this week, that the broadcast will come to you at the regular 7:45 P.M. time. Elwin Bullard writes that he heard the program last week and that he had fairly good reception excepting for some interference from WADC. He says that he feels sure that if more of the NRC listeners would try for the broadcast that they would be surprised to find how well the program comes in. We hope that you will take Elwin's advise and try for this broadcast, and if you hear it, won't you please drop us a card c/o the York Broadcasting Co., telling us how well you heard the program. Ye editor has been receiving reports from Mass. N. H. and Vermont quite regularly during the past few weeks.

Earl Roberts advises us that XEFJ was on the air on the 26th instead of the 23rd as we had advised you. We are very glad to see that quite a few of our members were fortunate enough to hear this broadcast anyhow. Earl says that CMAF can be heard on 680 kycs. in the early evenings lately.

Elwin Bullard writes that he is going to make every effort to have all of the radio clubs in on the Inter-Club Co-operation Plan next season. We are sure that the huge success of this Plan this season is proof enough for those clubs who were skeptical about it, to have them join next season. Who is there that can deny the great success that this plan met this season???? We feel confident that when all the clubs are in on this plan that clashing of DX programs will be completely abolished. Ye editor wants to take this opportunity of congratulating those gentlemen who so successfully worked out this plan. We feel that it is the greatest stride forward that has been made in the DX field.

We have just received a letter from station WDEL 1290 kycs, San Juan, Porto Rico in which they have informed us of a change in their DX schedule. Their station instead of being on the air every other week as had been the case for awhile, are now heard the Second Sunday morning of each month from 5:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. This would therefore make the date of their next DX program on Sunday morning, March 10 from 5:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. They have reassured us that this program is to be dedicated to the members of our club, let's all listen in and send in our reports. You will recall that they gave us a program some time ago, and that at that time we did not know it was to have been dedicated to us, therefore we felt that it was not our fault if they did not receive many reports from our members, however they have notified us this time and we want to hear that the response to their program for our club was very satisfactory.
