We have so much news on hand at this time that we are able to get an early start on this week's Bulletin. We hope that all of the news that we have on hand for you this week will be of interest to all of our members.

First of all your editor is in receipt of a fine letter from WRUF, 830 kcs. Gainesville, Florida, in which they have advised him that they plan to run three DX programs this winter, a portion of each will be dedicated to our club members. The dates for these broadcasts will be January 9, February 20, and March 19, all of these programs will take place between 2:00 and 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. This station is very eager to receive a lot of fine reports on these broadcasts, so let's all do our duty and send in a report on them.

The next news comes from Floyd Smith our Greenville, Ill. CPCer who advises us that in a recent letter from Lester Zellmer, our good friend at WTRC, says that inasmuch as his over-sleeping was responsible for the recent program for our club taking the air 45 minutes late, that they have decided to dedicate the first hour of the Xmas DX Party on Sunday morning, December 15 to the members of our club. This program is to be on the air between 5:00 and 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. Hence our portion of this program will take place between 5:00 and 6:00 A.M.

DX seems to have improved some during the past few days and we have therefore been able to pick up more stations than we had been for about two weeks. We have noted that we have been getting fairly good reception from LYA recently around 5:00 A.M. so let us therefore suggest that those of you that as yet do not have this station, that this seems to be about the best time to try for them.

Ye Editor is also in receipt of a letter from CMOX 1320 kcs. Havana, Cuba in which they have advised us concerning their DX schedule for this winter, which will again take the form of a monthly DX program, which will be aired the 13th of each month, with one exception, from 3:00 to 6:00 A.M., E.S.T. That one exception takes place in December at which time the program will be heard on the 14th. The program of November 13 has been designated as being for the members of our club.

Also on the 13th of November, we find that KRNT 1320 kcs. Des Moines, Iowa will dedicate a program to the members of our club from 6:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. Our members are all urged to listen in and send in your reports.

Last week we advised you that WGAR had notified Walter C. Birch that they would put on a DX program on Saturday morning, November 16 from 5:00 to 6:00 A.M., E.S.T. We have just received another advice from Walt in which he tells us that WGAR have changed their minds about the date for this program and that it will now positively take place on Sunday morning, November 17 from 4:30 to 6:30 A.M., E.S.T. Incidentally this program is going to be dedicated to all the clubs in the Inter-Club Cooperation Plan, therefore we want them all to take note of the change in date and time for this broadcast, inasmuch as the station has asked us to notify the other clubs of this change. We will try to notify all the clubs by letter, in the meanwhile, but in the event that we do not, please take note, as the station has promised to put on a very fine pro-

DO YOU KNOW...that WBNY, 1370 kcs., Buffalo, N. Y., is scheduled to begin operations in the week of November 4th...that it looks as if Utah will soon have some new stations, (after legal battles are fought)...that WIBC, Muncie, Ind., and WTRC, Elkhart, Ind., both on 1310 kcs., will increase their power to 100 watts...that WJR, 750 kcs., Detroit, Mich., received official OK on their 50 kw...that the big change in the broadcasting spectrum (recently mentioned in DX CHATTER) is already under way with the FCC being advised by their engineers. Whole proceedings are shrouded in deepest secrecy, but we'll endeavor to keep you advised from time to time through our news source...that the 532-foot radio tower at Langenberg, Germany (which broadcasts KOLN: Cologne), collapsed in a recent hurricane, it was made of wood, having a vertical aerial running down the center. An auxiliary xmtr will do the work in the meanwhile, but Cologne, Germany, won't be so easy to hear over here!...that we are advised, KRNT, 1320 kcs., Des Moines, Iowa, comes on the air at 5 A.M., daily. (Our information does not state whether this is CST or EST,) (Ed. note:-This is CST as we recently received a letter to that effect from KRNT)...that XEC (not 1160 kcs.) 1170 kcs., Tiajuana, Mexico is on the air until 1 A.M., EST., so how can 30 watts break thru WCAU's 50 Kw?...that XEFL, 1155 kcs., Tiajuana, Mexico, are a twenty-four hour station...that KWJJ, 1040 kcs., Portland, Ore., is on the air from 12:01 to 6 A.M., EST.....that WJBO, 1420 kcs., Baton Rouge, La., will DX monthly the second and fourth Sunday from 2 to 4 A.M., EST...that PTT, Lyons-Tramoyes, France, on 648 kcs., is testing a new 60 KW xmtr daily between 2:30 and 7 A.M., EST....that Sottens, Radio Suisse Romande, Switzerland, is using 100 kw. on 677 kcs....that WAML, 1310 kcs., Laurel, Miss., is once again broadcasting after a period of five months absence from the air, so you'll find them on frequency check tests once again (1st Tuesday-5:20-5:40 A.M., EST). A. W. Oppel, N.P.O. #2, Irvington, N. J. - Reception Nov. 1st, at 5:30 to 6:00 A.M., EST, very poor, noisy, with rainy weather. Stations evening prior to this date heard with good volume. KNX, KFI, KOA, XEW, CKOC, and CMCY heard with local volume between 8 and 10 P.M., EST, on the 31st. Needed WMFG, Hibbing, Minn., but couldn't get it. Using a Philco 116X with 100 feet of mediocre aerial. Reception Nov. 2nd: 5:45-6:15 A.M., EST fair. Noise level fairly high, but reception going towards a peak. Needed KWTN, but couldn't hear. Did hear and receive WCMI, with fine volume and no fading. Reception Nov. 3rd: 12:30 A.M., EST. Good, stations with ample power, coast QSA-4, R-7-8, south QSA-3, R-5-6. Had to work, couldn't DX. Reception Nov. 4th: 4 A.M., EST. Good, stations had good power, especially from the North and West. Noise level not high. Several low powered coasters heard. Reception Nov. 5th: 5 P.M., EST. Good, stations having fine power, from all points of compass, with CKOC, 1120 kcs., Hamilton, Ont., overriding everything on channel. Set very selective this afternoon. Weather conditions poor from a visual standpoint, but power of stations belying this observation. Weather probably to be rainy.

Tuning the SW3 the other afternoon, we ran across NOV testing with some field station. NOV was using a channel in the vicinity of 70 m. Radex lists this Coast Guard transmitter under a group operating on 112.20 meters with 200 watts.

W3CSJ reports a contact last Saturday evening with HI71G of Santo Domingo. W3CSJ is on 75 m. phone. At breakfast time Sunday morning VE3-AAC was plowing through the 150 meter band with an R9 signal. CO6OM is still coming through with his usual R9 carrier. W2AD, friend Andy Sanello of the Manhattan Merrygorounders (an NBC program), is going to blossom out some evening with an all night DX. W2AD has an ear splitting signal on 1931 kc. Runs 600 watts to his final amplifier.
