Shanghai, China, is back on the Short Waves. The station, which was bombed by Japanese warplanes, has evidently been repaired because NBC was heard rebroadcasting a SW transmission from Shanghai.

SINGLETON & ELIMINATOR CONTEST.

We desire at this time to amend the 7th rule as set forth last week. Scoring will remain the same on all Singletons, but the Eliminator will be changed. Henceforth, the person who eliminates a Singleton, will be credited with half of the value in points of the original Singleton, whereas that person whose Singleton has been eliminated will lose half of the value in points of the Singleton. These points will be added or subtracted from the total number of points credited each person.

DX GLEAMINGS

IT'S IN THE NEWS THAT...WTAL, 1310 kcs., Tallahassee, Fla., were granted a boost in day power to 250 watts...Ditto to KWNO, 1200 kcs., Winona, Minn...rumors have it that the Lower California Union has launched a drive to rid that section of American owned stations, if this is so, the whole of Mexico may follow suit, which would result in ridding the air waves of Drs. Brinkley and Baker, and some of the other all night pests...requests for verification from XELO, should be addressed to Box 6, San Diego, Calif...Amos 'n' Andy will switch over to a soup concern after the first of the year, and Pepsodent are rumored to be trying out the Mickey Mouse Show as a replacement...MBS is still trying to bring a bout closer connections with WLW, meanwhile two additional stations have been added to the WLW line; KWK, St. Louis and WJJD, Chicago. In addition to these the following stations are members of the WLW hook-up; WSAI, Cincinnati; KQV Pittsburgh; WFIL Philadelphia; WBAL, Baltimore and WHN, New York, the latter of which supplies the following stations with the same program; WINS, New York; WABY, Albany; WSAY, Rochester; WIBX, Utica; WBNY, Buffalo and WMBO, Auburn...Out of 45 stations which had been operating in Shanghai, only 12 remain on the air. XHMA is credited with having done valiant work, whereas Japanese planes have attempted to destroy XGOA, the powerful Government station, who had been putting their cause against Japan on the air, so that the whole world might know...Canada fears that Gladstone Murray will import regulations, such as govern the BBC, with reference to Sunday programs. If this be true, then it means goodbye to sports programs; dance programs and programs of light entertainment. A hearing will be conducted on November 16...WFIL, 560 kcs., Philadelphia, will advance their sign off time until 2 A.M...October, 1938 will usher in the new regulations which will ultimately put into definite use, each channel from 10 to 300,000 kilocycles. It is expected that it will be several months before the real scramble for new frequencies begins...stations shall now be required to make station announcements as frequently as possible during the hours of operation. In no event shall more than 30 minutes elapse between such announcements...KGFV, 1310 kcs., Kearney, Nebr., granted increase in day power to 250 watts...
