WKAQ was hrd 4/8 at 8:55 pm, were Q5 R8 blotting out everything on 620 kcs, they faded at 9:01. KFWB was very poor but reported anyway, were Q3 R2-4 at 1:20 am on 4/18. The static was awful but I managed to make out a few words about bowling, wasnt sure it was KFWB but Los Angeles was mentioned twice so I took a chance on it and it turned out right. Verie in 30 days signed by Harry Myers C.E.. XEG came in 9 days and signed by M E Seifler, card was blue. WGBG hrd 7:29-7:30 on sign off on 4/5, full page verie. KSL said no veries during the duration. Reports sent to WSPA-KWID-KGEI.

TED BAMBERGER-SHAKER HEIGHTS O Reports to these stations since last issue. WAWZ on equipt test, WJAR-WISR-CKNX-WORD-WKBN-KFAS on reg sked-WABY WSAJ-WEBR-WPAR-WLOA-KRMD-KPDN-WDWS-WMGA-WMSL-KGHF on freq test-and XEWV TI4NRH-COHI-WJQ-COCH-YV5RN-COKG on SW. Veries rec include cards and letters from WSJS-WAWZ-WTJS-WSTP-CKNX-CMq-WIAC-WABY-WOPI-WGNC-WJQ. WSJS in after 10 weeks, also reminder to WLAK-WGPC-KVGB. Quite a list. Underlined are all fb cards WWRO's being red and silver on blue. WLB is silver on brown and orange and WOMI is colored view of xmitter bldg and KWYO card if of the tower. WGBG is longest verie letter received signed by Ed Carlos the program director. KGFL is happy to received a report from Westfield-Hi Grant. WOC is going on 1420 kcs the middle of July. Latest DX includes KPRO-WFOR-KPLC-KFYO-KOME-WGL-WKRO-WAYX-WJMG-WCOV-WPAY-KIUP-WORD-KIT-WSAJ-KONO-KBTM-WTRC-KHLH and reported to most of them. Fewer than usual foreign verics were rec this year but those in were very welcome. TI4NRH-YV5KI and YV4RA thanks to Club specials and also snagged HJCU-WIAC and 4Q3 on the side. 4Q3 sent me 2 verics which are by the way my 25th Aussie veric. The rest of my verics are from the domestics, Mexico with XEF-XEPI both hrd previous. Cuba with CMKY using but 100 w. Canada with more than usual, CPGP to complete Alberta; CKVD CBJ completing Quebec and from CFOS-CBL-CHEA, bringing total to 108 Canadians with only 6 active yet to verify. The balance are from the good ole USA. most welcome were KYUM thru WBDC; KPFA ditto thru 1490; California completely verified except KPAS with ones from KPHO-KFMB who said mine was first from ny state; KFRE also 1st from NY and US and finally KVCV who verified double card after several trys. ## Radio Stations and The War by Len Kruse

While taking a ten day vacation through Illinois-Indiana and Michigan before my service with Uncle Sam I visited several radio stations such as WSBT-WTRC-WKZO. As you possibly know stations today are forbidden to have visitors according to government regulation but after informing the receptionists at the station that I was a DXer I had no trouble in viewing part of the station and getting some information that will be of interest to us DXers. The war affected stations very little in this locality in regard to personal changes as they informed me of having only 2 or 3 leave for that reason. The largest station visited told me that their engineers had been deferred from the draft for the time being because of their work. Personally I question if all stations engineers are automatically deferred, except remote broadcasts such as the man in the Street there has been little or no change. However they did note a little change with programs originating from the networks. All in all radio advertising did not suffer up to this time but no doubt will see affects of the war like everything else according to the commercial manager of station WSBT.

The rest of Len's visits will be included in the August 8th bulletin. There not being room here we do not wish to use another half page and leave the rest blank. Everything with the exception of Lens visits to the stations is cleaned up with this issue. Wee'll be seeing you Aug 8th.
