I plan to visit them. I liked Carrol's account of the convention. Come on you CPC and would be CPC men, drop me a line, my GRA is 438 East 21st St. BROOKLYN N.Y. (Hope your vacation was swell) BOB BROWN-GOSHEN IND. The latest veries here are WMJ & WJMA, along with WISN-WTRC-WIND-WKBW-KXEL-LS1. Reports are out to WFIN-WCLE-WSB-WOWO-WIP-WKRC-WMHI-WCAR-WFBM-KFI-WGY-WBT-WHAM-WCAU-WJZ-WPTF-KDKA-CBL-XEAW on 1010 So you can see that I have been quite active logging locals. In April 1941 I sent a report to WIND. This spring I sent a follow up..still not an answer. Last week I copied it agaon one afternoon and sent another report..verie was back in 5 days.. I cant figure these stations out. Latest veries are letters from WHBL with Ekko stamp; KWON by Gill Ownby who said he visited in town a block from my place and was leaving for the signal copps next morning; CHEX in 4days with sked; WHUB-KID airmail dandy letterhead with map of KID service area on back and signed by a former Iowan also leaving for service; wRUF-WBTM wants reports from my region. Also hear WALL on 1340 kcs up in middletown NY every day. Only verie received was from WLIB for report sent on their 1st day of broadcasting on 1190kcs. Have done considerable Sw listening but no attempt to send reports. See where Jim Wedewer heard KIUP check I heard both the ones in June and July which my pard, Dick Sweetland dedicated to me and the NRC. Have been hearing Radio Debunk's old 40 meter freq with same stuff in Spanish with musical identification of Yankee Doodle, also German propaganda station on same band directing all its broadcasts to Anzacs.

FRANK CORYELL-CLEVELAND HEIGHTS Q. I never really understood how poor summer reception was until now. Its positively disgusting, I cant even hear KFI until past 3AM and then only about R4. I have received some veries though, on the BCB KFUO with station folder-WEOA-WTMJ-WWL the 2nd WLOF-WERC-KSO-WJAS-CBL-CBJ-WLIB-CBY-WJSP-WFBC-WAOV-WKY daytime report-WHKC-WHIS-WHIO-WHK-WOSU-WOMI-WHJB-KXEL-WMBS-WKAR-WJZ and 2 nice cards from HOK and HJAN. On SW veries were from W5XAU-CBFY-CFRX-WCDA-WJQ- and after 6 months Brazzaville. LEN KRUSE-DUBUQUE IA (Here is the remaining part of Lens report from last time-this too was cut short because of time but your editor feels that the information it contains should be forwarded to all you members) The first special DX program I heard for months came from WAOV, Vincennes Ind on 7/18/42 from 2-3AM with R7 sig. Claude Harris, CE informed me of this program but as there were no bulletins it was impossible to notify you fellows. Nice letter verie in several weeks from this program. Have you hrd Iowa's new station? KXEL-50,000 watt clear channel on 1540 kcs in Waterloo Is took the air on 7/14. On loth day of broadcasting I visited this station and found them to have the nicest set-up I have ever seen and above all their beautiful studios which are located on the 4th floor of the Insurance Bldg in Waterloo and at Iowa State Teachers College at Cedar Falls. The Call letters KXEL denote "Excel" which I found to be true of the station in every sense of the word. "The Voice of Agriculture" is their slogan. While visiting htere I had a delightful \$ hour interview with Ken Morton, traffic manager and through him I got the inside dope on KXEL. Their operating sked is 5:30AM to MDT daily and Sun days 8Am to MDT CWT, the Blue Network furnishes them with 75% of their programs. Don Kasser is CE and Joe Dumond is manager of KXEL. All DX reports are promptly answered by C R Rohde, mailing Dept supervisor. While visiting Waterloo I stopped in at WMT studios on the mezzanine floor of the Russell-Lampson Hotel. Howard Roberts, manager gave me the history of the station from the early thirties till at present using 5KW full time. "The Voice of Iowa" and "The News Station of Iowa" is slogans used by them. CBS furnishes WMT with 85% of their programs and a few from Mutual. DX reports are always answered by CE-C.F. Quentin at Cedar Rapids Their sked daily 5:30-MDT & Sundays 7AM-MD1 CWT. The first few days in August while visiting in Chiagad, I visited the studios of WBBM & WJWC formerly WHIP. Their call letters have been changed on July 11th and was the majority of their personnel, following the change of ownership to John W. Clarke, thus the new call letters. WJWC is on daily until 1:35 AM EWT with the last half hour with recorded music, so an ideal time to log them. Their slogan used is "News of Plenty on 1520". Chicago stations are very strict with having visitors so I was refused admittance to WIND WJJD-WAIT-WGN. How's this for a patrotic slogan "W-A-I-T", Wait but dont wait to buy war bonds and stamps. Within the next few days Private 1st Class Merlin Steen, formerly of Decorah Ia and the NRC but now serving in the Army at Fort Bragg, is planning to visit me, (Cont on next Page 5

The old club members will especially remember him as really being a DX-Shark and also being an active NRC member. About the mid dle of July I visited Jim Wedewer's home and had another grand chat on DX in general with him. Incidentally he gets the credit for telling me that Kansas City's newest radio station KXKX on 1590 kcs is now on the air. Try for it fellows. Acting on recommendation of Secretary of Navy that there is an urgent need for a station at Portsmouth, Va where the large US Naval base is located, FCC granted a construction permit for a station there. The new station will be 250 watts on 1490 kcs. Both WSNY Schenectady and WJRM, Eikens W Va are yet incomplete (Len Lefty has hrd WSNY so they must be on) and now question if FCC will let them complete til till after the war. CHPS a new 250 watter on 1450 kcs in Parry Sound, Ont is expected to go on the air the latter part of July. While WPD4 in Jacksonville set next Sept 1st as their approximate starting date on 1270 kcs with 5KW full time. KSJB are the new call letters of KRMC in Jamestown N.D. which also shifted from 1400 to 600 kcs but still operates with 250 watts. WSIX, Nashville Tenn has shifted to 980 kcs with 5 KW full time on June 12th. Still another shift is KTKC, Visalia Calif to 940 kcs and increase to 5KW. The Mutual Networks 205th affiliate KTTS, Springfield, Mo joined last month. (while on changed your editor will add a couple more; WJW is now on 850 kcs with 5KW, and WHKY is testing on 1290 kcs and will start reg sked on there Sept 1st.) 9645 LLH Oslo, Norway is hrd well 9:55-10:55 PM with English announcements and music box tune at 9:55 PM.

9730 CE970 Valparaiso, Chili is being hrd well to Midnight. Has anyone received a verie from them?

9960 HCJB (uito, Ecuador same program as 12455 kcs is hrd very well considering its power only 1 KW. Used to be on 4107 kcs.

11620 COK Havana Cuba definitely on this frequency, not 11630 kcs as in IDA. Also is not on, on Sundays and Holidays contrary to reports.

11721 Asuncion, Paraguay-Radic Teleco is being hrd well as late as 11 PM Promised verie card but not yet arrived.
