TIPS and LPO REPORTS

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DR JOHN W KIRK-POINT PLEASANT W VA. Not much doing since last time. Am still getting the big west-coast stations, but not much good DX. Conditions just aren't right, and just don't have the time to listen. Also perhaps loss of interest during the summer months. Did get in a verie from YV5RI which pleases me quite a bit. Heard them on regular schedule back in March (21) at 10 PM. When they finally got around to sending me a verie, they sent it by Air-mail costing them 65 cents. Could anyone give me any info what so ever about the station at Sat Tal Via Bhim Tal, India I know positively that there is a station there, but I do not know the freq, power, call or type of station, or anything else about it. Any info would be appreciated. A letter from India dated June 6 mentioned this station to me, and I would greatly appreciate additional info. I do know that the town mentioned (Sat Tal Via Bhim Tal) is a very small place, perhaps 2 dozen families, and that it is up in the Indian Mts. One of the vacation spots in India. One thing more. I have recently been criticized for verifying foreign stations in War Time. Personally I have always tried to verify anything heard, and at present intend to continue this policy. I can see nothing out of order in trying to verify foreign stations just because there is a war going on. My idea being that if there was objections from the postal authorities, the State Dept or the censors that the request for verification (or verie coming back to me) would not get through. However apparently some DXers have different ideas. I just sort of think that I should or would like to know how the majority of DX fans feel about this subject. "Should we or should we not attempt to verify foreign stations during war time" Certainly I would not want to do so if it would cause any possible harm to DX, however I cannot personally see how it could cause and harm, and certainly it seems better to try to verify what one hears as soon as possible rather than waiting till the end of the war to do so. ( Your NRC Editor can see no harm in verifying foreign stations anytime. The few reports that are sent to any foreign station today will not cause any hardships on the censors. If they do not want your report to go through, they will return it to you in very short order. If it would amount to sending hundreds of reports, then I might be inclined to say do not verify, but we all know that no foreign station gets over 3 or 4 reports for any single broadcast. In the years past there were many hundreds of DXers, but today it can be safe to say that there isn't over 500 active DXers right now and I will go further and say that 500 is putting it very high. I base my facts on the amount of reports the stations who DXed for the NRC in the past 4 years, have received, and in that bunch there were some very rare catches to be had, yet the station reports receiving abt 50 to 75 reports, and most of them reported less than 50 reports, so someone please show me where there are more than 500 active DXers. Now as far as hurting the DX game, only the Active DXers can do that, and certainly a few DXers who report to foreign stations aren't going to harm our hobby, at least I can't see how. And may I say here that from my experience, the Harm is caused by DXers not reporting to stations who DX for them, also those who do report and because a verie isn't forth coming in a little while sit down and write one of those insulting letters, demanding a verie, with the possibility that their report isn't worth the paper its written on. And lastly those DXers who report, ask for a verie and fail to include return postage. I might also add that reports from radio station putting on DXes for the NRC say very nice things about our members. It is very rare that an NRCer reports with out including return postage and they say that their reports are most interesting.

Dr Kirk would like your opinions, so drop him a line at 415 1/2 Main St at the QRA at the top. After receiving them Doc can compile the results and let us know the results and opinions of the other members. -Ray)

The 8th was also the first time I have DXed since last April. Joe Jr is on his way home from the South Pacific. Has been over there 26 months. Wont that be a thrill when he steps in here at 415 South 11th St. Weather here is very hot and everything is burned up. Bill Stone is in a hospital in Montreal. Francis in action in the Invasion. (Well Joe I am sure that it will be one glad day to see Joe Jr. Hope that he has a real long time at home) (Will write some day, just busy and busy now)

LEFTY COOPER-BROOKLYN N Y No DX been done here since early April and I'm enjoying the "vacation" and I think I'll enjoy DXing even more come next October. I'm holding back arranging DX programs on 1400 kc until I find out what WHBQ plans to do. They may soon have a silent period, according to a letter from them. Speaking of the CPC, I think Bill Gabriel and Al Bartholomew deserve your votes for the board of Directors, for they have really pitched in and worked for our Club. Few veries in since close of season, they were FIA, FGA-FZK (Radio Dakar) and 3XY in Melbourne, Australia, 1420 kes with 600 watts on 2/29/44 (IDXs round the world tests) Radio Dakar states they use 12kw except on 9778 which is 1200 watts and only 200 watts on 8390 kc. Sure was glad to add 3XY to my collection for their card is a 4 tone color and a beauty.
