I want to thank all of you and tell you that on each Thursday morning we will endeavor to run a test program from 5:00 to 5:15 A.M. for the benefit of all the DX fans and also for our own test purposes. I would appreciate it very much if you would notify the secretary of each of the numerous radio clubs you belong to so that they can all get a chance to log a 250 station. That is, a 250 watt station." Signed F.J. Sheehan, C.E. This is a vy nice gesture on their part, don't you think, and well worth publicizing! Veries still slow in arriving. Received 6 on 12/30, and then none till 1/4 when 2 more arrived. Still have 52 reports out unanswered. Heard someone sign off on 1320 Kc/s. 1/4 @ 3:01 AM, but did not get call, anyway it wasn't KXLF, and it was a new station. (Apparently WEGO, Pop! -Ed.) As to the new department "Question Box" I believe the boys would do a lot better by reporting good items to "DX Down the Dial". This question box was in effect a while back & if I can remember correctly, no one received anything good from it. My opinion is that if a DXer hears a couple selections and no call, location, etc. he would do much better to forget it & try again. If information is received in such a manner, the senders report is delayed & if I were a station operator I would refuse to verify anything that was post-marked later than 24 hours after the date of transmission. Also would like to comment on the bickering going back and forth. My contention is that we are DXers and all of us are trying to verify as many stations as possible, why not let us all sit down and think for a while, then make up your minds to keep it as a DX Bulletin pertaining to things that really help our hobby & help other members to hear more stations. It is also suggested that all of us keep in mind Lefty's suggestion, use a separate sheet or at least put items for "DX Down the Dial" in such a manner that it can be torn from your report & kept separate, and again use that column, as I have heard many of the boys say that they have gotten more information from there than anywhere else. It is hoped that you boys will take the above suggestions as trying to help, as I know what a job it is to arrange the members' reports, etc., for the cutting of the stencils. Lefty is doing swell and it is up to each and every one of us to report so as to make it easier for him. So what say, boys, report often, keep your reports full of information that will help your fellow member and report good items to "DX Down the Dial."

PLEASE MENTION N.R.C. WHEN REPORTING TO ALL STATIONS. IT HELPS YOUR CLUB, FELLOWS! -ED.

Well boys the time has come when the National Radio Club will have to increase its annual dues from \$2.00 to \$2.50 a year. The reasons are simple and here they are. Mimeograph Pager has increased 50% in price; The stencils have increased 17½% in price, Envelopes have increased 75% in price and Mimeograph Ink increased 25% in price. These increases are of course the difference in price from 1940 to 1946.

It should be remembered that the National Radio Club is the only Club that issued its regular quota of bulletins throughout the War period. And is today the ONLY DX CLUB issuing weekly bulletins during the DX Season. Your club issues 34 bulletins each full year whereas the other clubs issue ONLY 19 bulletins a year. Yet their Dues are at \$2.00 per year. So from the above information it is hoped that all of you can understand why this increase. You have been getting nearly TWICE the number of bulletins per year from the NRC as has anyone else from the other Clubs he is a member. This price increase will go into effect January 25 1947.

Our apology to the New Zealand DX Club for omitting Credit due them regarding the Poem appearing at the bottom of Page 8 and sent in as if it was by Ralph Johanns. He did not mention to our Editor that it was taken from your bulletin. Sorry.

LONG WAVE

In the last issue of our bulletin it was talked about having some Long Wave info inserted. It seems that this part of the band is heard by only a very few and that only a very few have receivers that are eligible to tune here. My contention is that why do subjects such as this be harped on. This was voted to be a BCB Club and from comments is satisfactory to the very great majority. I at one time had a receiver that would tune this long wave band and although I listened and listened I failed to get even a trace of anything but the weather stations and Air-port beams. I do agree that on the East Coast other reception is possible, but then to a long antenna has to be used and how many of us are in a position to be erecting antennas of that kind. It is then suggested that any of you who are interested drop a card to your Board Chairman. Dick Cooper 956 Orr Ave., Kittanning, Penn.

Now regarding the so called illegal stations on the air and heard by our members. Yes Lefty has taken steps to omit such items from members reports. This is within his rights as Editor. However after reading the comment from a few members on this, what say that the NRC publish such calls and if in the opinion of the Editor, he believes it to be an illegal station, underline such information and bring it to the attention of the F.C.C. It might help them to arrest and convict the operator of such a station. And if so, Your EXEC SEC hopes that the F.C.C. gives them the limit of punishment for in my opinion and being a Law enforcement officer myself, I believe that the violation of any law shows a disregard for all laws. I also believe that anyone hearing such a station should do all in his power to help the proper authorities trace it down and help expose operators of such stations. They certainly are no help to anyone.

I would also like to talk a little on comments made by a few members regarding information that they believe should be published in the bulletin. It has been said that the NRC does not publish station addresses. I have failed to have any report of reception returned to me because I had no station address on it other than the Stations Call and the City and State it was located in. Here in the United States we have good mail service and anything mailed first class will get directory and every other kind of service available in order to deliver it to the right place.

The same applies to the Chief Engineers name. As you can notice lately they have been changing almost as fast as the weather. In checking my 1049 veries roughly I find that less than 30% are signed by Chief Engineers. There is a big variety of signers from the President of a station to an Operator. In a very recent case I tuned and reported to KFAB who tested on 1110 kc with 50KW and asked for reports and announced that they should be sent to Station KFAB Omaha, Nebr. I did as asked and yet my verie came back on Jan 9th this year and was mailed from Lincoln, Neb., and signed by the Lincoln Manager. Yet this report was addressed to the Chief Engineer because it was thought that he would be the party most interested in this report. Now under the above circumstances, and if the name and street address meant anything, how come the Station Manager in another city answered this report. It certainly wasn't the U.S. Mail's doings. However if a station hasn't been verifying and someone finally gets one, then I say the signer should be published as this will be a help to others. Also reports to other countries, yes all the information available should be given including name-street etc as the mail service in those countries is poor and can not compare to ours.

It has also been noticed that many a time station schedules are given. In most cases they are absolutely useless to anyone because they sign on at 6 and off at Mdt., along with about 10 or 15 others and in most cases nothing is heard but a mess and guessing comes in handy for reports. However if a station has a late sign off or an early sign on, then it will be a help to others. For instance in verie I just received from WRNO. They state that they sign on at 5:30 AM EST MONDAYS ONLY. Yet someone reported that they sign on 5:30 AM Daily. So it shows that some of the boys hear something once and take it for granted. Other AMs WRNO signs on at 6 AM and I failed to get anything on them to report.

It must be remembered that both your Editor and Exec Sec work daily. One works 5½ days a week and the other 6 full days, so it doesn't leave too much time to complete a bulletin. That is why I have suggested that each and every one of you boys take a little time when you write out your reports to the Editor. Keep important items for the "DX Down The Dial" and the others in your members report. To me such information as to how a DX program was heard does not belong in the DX Down The Dial column or that a certain station was heard such and such a time, which in all probability happened a week or 10 days ago. I believe that known tests and F/C and any late or early sign ons or offs and coming test dates should be listed along with information that will be of some help to others in hearing a station. Then as to your members report. Keep it interesting and give DX info such as veries rec and if they were cards or letters. A description of the card or letter head is unimportant. Keep the bickering out of your report. If you have personal items to say to another write him, not use the bulletin as part of your personal correspondence. I do not mimeograph extra copies of the bulletin account of the cost. I did but most of the time they just layed here and in the end were a loss of material. Prices are too high to print extra ones. So while on it, if your bulletin is mailed 3rd class and it does not arrive as usual, please wait at least 10 days before asking if we have another one. All bulletins are mailed from Buffalo either on Friday afternoon or early Saturday morning without fail and they leave here promptly. Many times they are held up along the line and 3rd class does not rate fast service. We do print up 2 extra copies in case a bulletin or 2 gets lost, but it has been very rare as it original has showed up in practically every case. So think it over boys and make the NRC newsy and full of DX info. All this is not giving you heck, but trying to show you how you can help your Editor get the most information in the bulletin and to make it as easy as possible for him. It isn't easy work to cut 10 or 12 stencils I can assure you. So let us all do our part and do it good. *Rau Edg E.*
