New Years of 1948 finds us doing a little checking up. Nearly nine years ago, I was sort of drafted into the job of helping a friend, in the old IIA, line up some BOB DX programs. Perforce I became a reporter, and, by slow degrees, was won away from SW. I find that leisurely DXing, with a consistent accent on club specials, through the years, has pulled in 354 veries, with a carefully kept heard list of 257. The past year has been most satisfactory: Today, all reports previous to 7/1/47, are judged delinquent and dis-qualification cards filed against the following stations: WAYN WAIM WSOY WBCC WJQS. This covers a 6 month period. KIOX card is about the prettiest job of verification that I ever saw. Now, in this case, the defect is minor, but the present participle of the verb, in the lower left hand corner, is a blemish, to the eye of the DXer. I have exchanged letters and experiences with Leo Herz, and wish to urge everyone of you to give him your support, in his efforts to publicize the DXer and his aims to the new, and sometimes old, stations. There is great need and Leo is giving time and money to help the others in this game. When you receive some communication, in reply to a report, which betrays the fact that there is uncertainty and confusion on the part of the writer, over these matters, drop Leo a card. Many fruitful contacts have been made, and a lot remains to be done. The job of watching all these stations is too big for one man. And please be sure to give the station signer's name and station address.

Notice in DX News that 7 members report recent veries from WPAK, 4 of them say it was for the DX. This includes our Vice-Chairman, yet the Editor wrote for definite verie, and I suppose that WPAK received or is in line for the Chairman of the Board's letter to "thank-you" stations. Notice that Mr. Modlin thought the post-card type verie would be nice, so he was quoted letter type used by WXAL, WKRT, WGWR, by the Editor. I thought Mr. Modlin might like to see post-card type, so I sent him 14 and commented on each and I included a couple that members often call 'lousy' and 'stinkers'. As "DX News" is sent to all stations DXing for NRC, it might be a good policy for members to refrain mentioning call letters of stations sending what they term as lousy and stinkers. Are we collectors of pretty postals and lovely letter-heads, or verification? Still battle for specials and don't think it worth while, there was CXAC on with WPAK, part of time WDNC was on with WRBC, had hard time to report KIOX because of Far-Eastern Network, AFRS banging in on 1270. And then too it is discouraging to lose sleep, rush report on special via first-class mail, and then wait longer than seems reasonable for verie. California seems to be worst offender, took KFCX 43 days and now KIEV us 64.61 days and the 3 DXes from Santa Barbara are all out over 30 days. These could learn from KGER 3, KFTS, 13, and WJAC 14. Regarding the letter I wrote to Mr. Modlin, I was not "out of bounds" - it is not a "thank-you" station, and besides the members have had no rules to direct, govern, regulate and instruct them during the past 4 months.

KPOF on surprise DX, 4:35-5:00. 12/27 - KJEA on 1380 logged Q4R9 2:00-2:06. WBAW-DX on 920 perfect signal. Got K2BK on 1530 for one of last chances 2:45-3:01, also WITA on 1400 testing 3:07-3:15. I didn't mean to hog a whole page in the Bulletin with my last letter. However, I will try to make this report for December shorter. First, to Derek Wharton, Chicago - My card from old KNEW, Carbondale, Pa., dated Jan 13, 1932, says that KNEW uses 10 watts. I guess I didn't get started on BCE DX in time to get those 5-watters as 10 is my lowest. During December, I managed to hit a few good ones and perhaps the best are: KENC-DX, KOKX with fine DX program, and plenty of announcements. KRFO, YVKA with election results but could not understand to report, KTMN, KIOX with swell card. XEBG, KSEW on t/off, BBC (1384) CKCL very fine on DX, KIAC, KDSH good on DX, KDHI testing same morning and surprise in CJFP on 1400, Riviere du Poup, which I didn't even know existed. Plenty of interference until 4:25 and I was not sure of the call letters until then, though I first heard them at 4:00. Last night (12/31) happened to catch WVET call letters for last one in 1947. and woke up about 4:15 a.m. 1/1 and tried for a little while to see if I could add one or two to start 1948 out. RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE NATIONAL RADIO CLUB

ARTICLE I - NAME AND PURPOSE

The name of this organization shall be the National Radio Club and shall be hereafter referred to as the N.R.C. The purpose of this organization shall be to promote the hobby of DXing and more specifically to promote broadcast band DXing.

ARTICLE II - HEAD-QUARTERS LOCATION

The head-quarters of the N.R.C. shall be at 325 Shirley Avenue, Buffalo 15, New York. In general, head-quarters shall be the residence of the Executive Secretary.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Anyone interested in the hobby of DX shall be eligible for membership in the N.R.C.

ARTICLE IV - BOARD OR DIRECTORS

The governing board of the N.R.C. shall be known as the Board of Directors (or more simply, the Board) and shall consist of 11 members, 10 voting members, and 1 - the Club President - a non-voting member. Ten of the Board Members are elected by the membership and the eleventh Board Member is the Executive Secretary. To be eligible for election to the Board, a member must be in his second consecutive year as a member in good standing in the N.R.C. The election of the ten elected members of the Board shall take place in April of each year. Voting instructions are issued to the membership by the Executive Secretary. Any member not wishing to run for election may request that his name be omitted from the ballot. The ten receiving the largest number of votes will constitute the elected part of the Board. In case a vacancy occurs on the Board, the person receiving the next highest vote in the previous election shall be named to this vacancy. The term of office for the Board members shall be for one year beginning with the day before Labor Day and terminating the day before Labor Day the following year.

ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF THE BOARD OR DIRECTORS

It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to administer the affairs of the N.R.C. and to promote the interests of the N.R.C. to the best of its ability. Any action taken by the Board must be ~~acted~~ by at least a majority of the Board members. Likewise, any action taken in the name of the N.R.C. must be approved by the Board members. Any N.R.C. member may submit questions, proposed rule changes or additions to the rules for action by the Board, but this can only be done through the Board Chairman and must be signed in ink by the member submitting the proposal; it will be mandatory to disregard any unsigned proposal. The Board Chairman, only, has the authority to submit questions to the Board members for a vote. Such communications from the Board Chairman to the Board members should be marked "Official Business." Such communications or others marked "Official Business" must be held strictly confidential. Board members shall reply to such communications requiring a vote within 10 days. If no reply is received within the required time, it shall be assumed that he does not care to vote on the subject. If he ignores such communications for 2 consecutive times, action shall be taken as provided for in Article XII.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS

The following officers shall be elected by the Board to serve for one-year terms: (1) Chairman of the Board; (2) Vice-Chairman of the Board; (3) President; (4) Vice-President; and (5) Executive Secretary. The Chairman of the Board, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, and the President must be members of the Board. The Vice-President does not have to be a member of the Board. The election of these officers should take place as soon after the Board members take office as possible and the terms of officer for each is one year. The Editor, Courtesy Progress Committee Chairman, and the Publicity Committee Chairman shall be elected by the Board. These three offices are held for indeterminate periods and an election is held for these offices only when a vacancy occurs.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS.

(1). The Chairman of the Board. The Chairman of the Board is responsible for the proper execution of all N.R.C. affairs. He has the power to appoint any committees or to call upon any member to assist him in so doing. Any action taken, however, must be approved by the Board.

- (2) The Vice-Chairman of the Board. The Vice-Chairman of the Board has no active duties other than being an ex-officio member of the Publicity Committee.
- (3) The President. The President shall represent the N.R.C. in all matters in an official capacity so long as any action that he may take is in agreement with the Board. The President shall vote on Board matters only when there is a tie vote among the other Board members.
- (4) The Vice-President. The Vice-President has no active duties.
- (5) The Executive Secretary. The officer of Executive Secretary combines the normal duties of a secretary and a treasurer. He shall be responsible for the collection of dues and likewise for an accurate as possible record of the club membership. He shall keep an accurate account of all monetary receipts and disbursements in the name of the N.R.C. He shall send to the Board Chairman every 3 months a complete financial report of the N.R.C. together with a condensed statement to the other Board members and club President. He shall likewise be responsible for ordering and maintaining a supply of such things as paper, envelopes, stencils, stamps, etc., necessary for the maintenance of the N.R.C. He shall also be responsible for any records or permanent equipment that the N.R.C. might own.
- (6) The Editor. The Editor shall be responsible for the publishing of the N.R.C.'s official publication, "DX News." Because of the amount of work involved in carrying out the duties of his office, the Editor shall not be Chairman of the Board. The Editor has the right to appoint an associate Editor or editors to assist in this work. The Editor may use his own discretion in selecting material for publication; that is, the Editor shall have the right to exclude from publication any member's report or portion thereof which the Editor believes would not be in the best interest of the N.R.C. Any problems arising from exclusion of such material from publication must be dealt with through the Board.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES.

- (1). Courtesy Programs Committee (C.P.C.) The C.P.C. shall be responsible for arranging special DX programs for the N.R.C. and shall work hand in hand with the Board in the best interest of the N.R.C. The Chairman of the C.P.C., because of the amount of work involved, shall not be a member of the Board. The Chairman of the C.P.C. shall appoint as many members to his committee as he deems necessary to carry out the work of the C.P.C.
- (2). Publicity Committee. The Publicity committee shall co-ordinate all publicity for the N.R.C. and in as many ways as possible promote the hobby of DX in general. The Chairman of the Publicity Committee with the help of his appointed committee shall be responsible for preparing material to be read on DX programs dedicated to the N.R.C. and also for write-ups in "shut-in" and hobby magazines. The Vice-Chairman of the Board shall be an ex-officio member of this committee.

ARTICLE IX - DUES.

Dues of the N.R.C. shall be \$2.50 per year, and should be sent to the Executive Secretary at N.R.C. head-quarters when due. All officers and members shall be required to pay dues; no honorary memberships will be given. A member who has paid his dues is a "member in good standing" and is entitled to receive the publications of the N.R.C. as they are issued and to all other benefits of the club. If a member fails to remit his dues when they are due, he is no longer a "member in good standing" and is no longer entitled to receive the N.R.C. publications.

ARTICLE X - "DX NEWS".

The N.R.C.'s official publication shall be known as "DX News." The Editor shall be responsible for its publication. Normally, there shall be 34 issues of this publication per year, but in cases of emergency and with permission of the Board, the Editor may change the number of publications. "DX News" shall be published weekly from October through March, twice monthly in April and September, and monthly in May, June, July, and August.

ARTICLE XI - CONTESTS.

All N.R.C. contests and the rules thereof must be approved by the Board. The N.R.C. will

not honor any verification entered by any member in any contest unless the station verified was heard on a receiver within twenty-five miles of the member's official residence. However, if a member is attending college and spends week-ends and vacations at home, he may enter verifications received from reports sent from either location providing the distance between the two points is not over 100 miles. If the distance is greater than 100 miles, he may choose either those sent from college or those sent from home, but not both. The rule likewise applies to any member sent to another city by his employer, that is, if the distance is not over 100 miles, he may enter verifications from both locations, otherwise he must make a choice between the two locations.

ARTICLE XII - REPRIMANDS AND DISMISSAL FROM MEMBERSHIP.

Any officer or member of the N.R.C. found guilty of conduct detrimental to the best interests of the N.R.C. by a majority of the Board shall, if the Board finds it to be a minor one, be reprimanded by the Board Chairman, if the offense is judged to be a major one, he shall be dismissed from the club. Any officer of the club soliciting members to join another DX club by asking them to drop their N.R.C. membership and/or making derogatory remarks about the N.R.C. shall be dismissed from his office and from the N.R.C., if found guilty of said offense by a vote of the Board; he shall likewise be ineligible for re-admission to the N.R.C. In case an officer is accused of mis-conduct, he shall not be allowed to vote on the matter.

ARTICLE XIII - ANNUAL CONVENTION.

The annual N.R.C. Convention shall be held on the Saturday and Sunday previous to Labor Day and Labor Day at the club headquarters location, unless decided otherwise by the Board.

ARTICLE XIV - AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS.

The Rules and Regulations may be amended or additions made thereto by a two-thirds vote of the Board.

ARTICLE XV - PLEDGE

All officers and members pledge themselves to uphold the above Rules and Regulations. Each officer and member will receive a complete set of rules. Officers will also receive a card which they will sign, acknowledging thereby, that they have received, fully understood and agree to abide by the rules and Regulations of the N.R.C. These cards are to be kept on file by the Board Chairman.
