ARTICLE V (2nd Paragraph) Voting "YES" HERZ-KRUSE-ADDY-MALEY-VAN VOORHEES-REILLEY-EDGE-STEELE-E COOPER; "NO" None; Not Voting-JOHANNNS.

REGARDING THE CONTINUED USE OF VERIFICATION LETTER TO STATIONS etc;- This is not a CLUB RULE but upon a motion was presented to the BOARD by CHAIRMAN HERZ; To Continue sending it out to any Station not sending a definite Verification, YES by ADDY-STEELE-E COOPER-VAN VOORHEES-HERZ-REILLEY-JOHANNNS-KRUSE; EDGE Voted "YES" but asked that it be restricted to only the NEW Stations or those who DX for the Club.

The following letter was drafted by Ernest R Cooper and your Exec Sec has been instructed to publish it and have it sent to Each NRC MEMBER.

Dear N.R.C. Member; The National Radio Club is about to finish its 15th consecutive season of service to the DXers of the nation and of the world. All these many years, the National Radio Club has been held in high esteem by most radio stations, and by virtually all DXers, whether or not they have been members of this Club.

We have many "veteran" DXers who have twisted their dials for the duration of our existence as a club, and who ~~will~~ are still just as avidly interested in the grand old hobby of DX today as they were 15 years ago, when the National Radio Club was born, in York, Penn. We also have many new members fellows who have only recently come into the hobby of DX. Some of these are college students-some are serving Uncle Sam. They have come to recognize the National Radio as a friendly group of DXers, who delight in passing tips among other members. They have had a great thrill, apparently, from their membership, as evidenced by their renewals. The veteran members have too, gotten much fun and help from our pages each week. They too have expressed their satisfaction with the club in their continued, year in and year out renewals.

Yes, the club has survived, not because of a few, but because of many. The reports we publish weekly bear us out on this point. Many new names have appeared recently in our DX NEWS and these younger DXers give every promise of becoming the standard-bearers of the hobby in the future. Ah yes future-what meaning that word has? It is probably the most indefinite word in the English language.

And the future of the National Radio Club right now is in jeopardy. We need some one to step forward now and offer his services, in order that the club might survive. We ask you, dear member, to ponder these words to follow very carefully.

Since 1940 Ray Edge has been turning out the pages of DX NEWS. Last year he mentioned that he would like to step down and retire from being this active. He finds that with his work-DX and Club work he has no time left to other things. He feels that he has served long enough. It had been planned to change over last September, but these plans did not materialize so Ray agreed to step in and continue for another season. But he feels that he must give up his post at the end of this season.

There you have the problem-a large void will thus be created. Some one must be our new publisher. Now as you know Ray has not only been our publisher but has handled the financial end of the club for many seasons as well. Only 2 years ago he was doing all the Editors work as well. In fact he was doing everything except run the CPC and serve on the Board of Directors or so it seemed to us. We also feel that for best interests of the club and members that his job should be broken up, or rather down a bit. that is, to create the positions of Treasurer, and that of Publisher.

We have had 2 kind offers from members who said they would be glad to take over the Treasurer's work, that is, to handle the membership dues and to do the club buying and take care of all financial matters, making out a report each month, which would be sent to the Board Chairman. Those offering to do this were Bernie Duffy and Fred Van Voorhees.

So, here is the problem-we need, and must have a new publisher. Now the Publisher need not have had previous similar experience-it is not a difficult job. Naturally all supplies, including the Mimeograph Machine will be supplied by the National Radio Club. The Publisher would run off the stencils sent each week by the Editor, and also sort-fold and insert them into the envelopes. No stamps will be necessary to bother with for the club would then use stamped-envelopes in the denominations of 1-1/2¢ 3¢ and 6¢ Which ever amount is needed would then be used by the publisher A bulletin of 9 or 10 sheets by 3rd class mail required 1-1/2¢ over that

the cost is 3¢. First class mail is 3¢ for each ounce or fraction, so a bulletin of 5 sheets costs 3¢ and over that 6¢, etc. Hence the 3 denominations.

As you know, the bulletins are weekly from the first Saturday in October up to and including the last Saturday in March. Twice in April and September and once each in May-June-July and August. Total of 34 each year. In the event you are wondering if this would keep you home-if it would prevent you from taking a vacation-may we say it will most certainly NOT. Your Editor will arrange his off seasons bulletins in such a way as to fit into what ever plans the new publisher has. The bulletin publishing day can and will be made for ANY day the new publisher wants it. The new publisher would have a voice in the Board too. The Editor of the Club has proposed legislation to that effect, that the Publisher, Treasurer and the Editor be considered permanent members of the Board of Directors, and also the Chairman of the Courtesy Programs Committee-with the other 5 Board positions to be voted upon by the membership at large. This will undoubtedly carry unanimously, for our present Board will welcome a chance to do something for the new publisher, who has by stepping in, done so much for us, the National Radio Club.

So, there are the cards on the table. If we do not get some one to take over, and jump into the breach, then there will be no more National Radio Club. That is not just strong talk-that is the gospel truth, for with no "DX NEWS" what would the club be? With no publisher, there can be no "DX NEWS" The eyes of the National Radio Club are scanning its membership-its roll call as it were for that man. WILL YOU OFFER YOUR SERVICES DXER? WILL YOU SAVE THE NATIONAL RADIO CLUB?

May we make a few suggestions? The mimeographing could be done at home-in your DX den or in the cellar, or the attic, or maybe at your Club, or at your Church, or at your office. The mimeograph machine, owned by the club, would be in your hands-you could use it in any other way you see fit. You could appoint any assistant publisher or publishers you wished from the ranks of the club or from the ranks of your friends or family. Ray often enlisted the help of his daughters in folding the pages for the DX NEWS or inserting them into the envelopes. We dont care where you live-Air-Mail will get the stencils there quickly.

We also want to assure you that you dont have to be an old-time member. You dont have to be a Board Member, nor do you have to be a super-DXer. You dont have to know how to type either. You could take the job, even if you just joined the club yesterday. We do want the newer members to know that they will immediately become "known DXers" and will swiftly be voted a permanent voice in all club affairs. We also want them to know they will be under no obligation what ever to attend any meetings, conventions or to make long distant phone calls or to be inconvenienced in any way, save the actual publication and mailing of the bulletin.

We are enclosing with this letter to you a POST CARD for your REPLY. It should be sent to the AUTHOR OF THIS LETTER Ernest R Cooper 438 East 21st Street, Brooklyn 26, N.Y. Please state your comments on one side and IF YOU CAN TAKE OVER THE PUBLICATION OR NOT, AND MAIL IT AS ASKED. Dont feel that you couldnt do the job well. Remember Ray stepped in with nary of experience and did OK. It will come easy to anyone or anyone interested in DX enough to save the Club and to become one of its main cogs, if not its very main one. Wont you give this matter your most careful consideration WONT YOU HELP US TO CONTINUE TO BE THE LEADING DX CLUB? ITS UP TO YOU NRC MEMBER.
