A nice card in an envelope was also received from KNEW for a duplicate. The 3 Houston veries, KING KNUZ & KRHT, were received within 2 days of each other. WHAW says that I was the only reporter to notice that they were off frequency on their first test; actually was 1460 plus, and hadroyned WADC. WMAW is another new station on the order of WCPA. Musings of the MembersBob Duggan - Hong Kong, China (ETM2)

Well, I'm now at Hong Kong for a short stop before going on up to Tsingtao. I've heard many weird radio stations lately - I can only guess at most of them, using the FBIS Foreign BOB list. Couple of weeks ago when down in Sydney, Australia, when the majority of the East Australian stations were logged. Also a new one on 580 Kc/s. was heard - must be in Queensland and using around 10,000 watts, judging from its signal strength. ZJV in Suva, Fiji, was heard several times. Possibly SAA in Port Moresby, Papua or 1250 was still - I never heard its call, but I'm sure I heard them. Near Canton Island one night, KRE's signal (Berkeley) pounded in with a couple hundred others from North America. Passing Manila, a couple of night signs. KCFM, KCRH, & KQPI were heard (710, 750, 800) - Believe they're the only ones on at present. No AFES stations are heard through Oceania, so I guess they're mostly signed off for good. Japanese and Chinese all over the dials at night. Here at noon I heard Hong Kong on 540, 835, with other Chinese near-by on 670 660, 690, 600, 860, 930, 1007, 1130, 1250. Only the 835 Kc/s. Hong Kong transmitter is in English - everything else is phooey. As we got our mail today, there were about 5 "DX Newses" that had at least found us. I'll be in Tsingtao for the Inner-Mongolian DX broadcast, so maybe they'll get at least one report, hi. Well, 73 and best of DX to all, from Hong Kong! (Lots of luck and smooth sailing to you, Bob! -Ed.)

Haven't done too much DXing of late. Guess I'm almost through for the season. Reports are out to KEMW WQTH KVLH WJAX WHEO WSSB CKBW. Veries in from KODI WJCR WEMO ZTRY WBYU (reg asked) WHAW CJVI. On Feb. 29, there was no sign of ECJB on 985 Kc/s., but did hear them on SW and they announced BOB frequency as 974 Kc/s. Went there, and still no sign of them. Too much WELB carrier. No sign of WQTH either and if I said I got XNWX, Langchow, China, you'd know I was a big liar. CKBW pounded in for the first 15 minutes and then static got bad. Got a good report off, though. WJAX, WHEO & WSSB caught testing on 2/28. Was this WJAX test program the program that was scheduled for 2/27? They were on at the time listed in the bulletin. Have sent 120 reports this season with answers from exactly 100 to date. During 1947 only 8 of 159 reports were un-answered. Some of those can still come back yet! Broke my rule on letters and mailed them a report. First one "south of the border" in a few years. Nothing else except KRON on 2/24 and WEOA, 1150, on 2/25, plus WHEO, 1050, WLTC, 1070, and CKBW on the 28th. Veries came from WJCR, WHAW WSAC WAIE WJAP WATO WWHI, all letters, and a card from ETAC on DX, also empty envelope, unsealed, but first class, from WAYB. DX has been generally good despite warm weather, unsettled air conditions. Missed most of the DXes by sleeping through 'em, but no sign of YSW on BOB here. Ditto on the IDXS scheduler.

For Stan Morse, the game you heard over XNWX is Jai Alai, the fastest game in the world! Now broadcast over XNWX Wed. through Sun., 1:00 a.m., E.S.T. On the special from WGIW a phone call from Herb was somewhat edged and "Claire de Lune" dedicated to him, this was only selection I heard title given, many stations still DX without announcing titles. On Feb. 19, I was listening to WJAX & heard acknowledgment of delayed report from E.R. Cooper of Brooklyn, who was very apologetic for delay in reporting and all that sort of thing! In recent DX News Lefty reports hearing this station on reg. early morning "corn" program. If this is good, why doesn't Lefty write the station direct and tell them he enjoys their "corn" program. On the ZIA Net DX from Gallup 13 of 15 selections hrd on 1230 that AM were from KCAK, a lovely letter-head. However, here are some facts about when some of the boys got started: Bob Botzum started in December 1930, and Warren Routschka started in the fall of 1932. Lefty Cooper began Dec. 28, 1932, and Frank Wheeler in December, 1939. Art Foerster first DXed in September, 1932, and Ralph Johanns started in the fall of 1944. Len Kruse started to DX in the fall of 1939, missing 2½ years while he was in the Army. Clarence Mustoe started up in December 1938, and Leo Herz in 1933. Ted Saling began his activities Nov. 7, 1937, and Bruce Kennedy did his first tuning in 1939. Hank Wilkinson, who verifies only foreign stations, started in 1933. The others did not send in the requested information.

Ralph Johanns suggests we list the state the DXer lives in (Johanns - N.Y.) and only list the ones who reported that particular month. Leo Herz suggests we list the sets each member uses. Hank Wilkinson has DXed both in Maryland and California, and Bruce Kennedy in Halifax and Toronto. Clarence Mustoe DXed in Columbus, Ga., Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, Meridian, Miss., and Colorado Springs, Colo. Leo Herz has tuned in Marcus, Iowa and in Chicago, Ill.
