HAWAIIAN TIME

Quite a discussion has been going on as to whether Hawaiian Time is 5 or 5½ hours behind E.S.T. Now Hal Wagner sends this letter to us, which he received from the Chamber of Commerce of Honolulu, Hawaii, which settles this point for once and all.

"Dear Mr. Wagner,

"We have received your letter of February 7 asking information about Hawaiian Time.

"Hawaii moved its clocks ahead one-half hour on June 24, 1949, and established Hawaiian Standard Time as ten hours behind Greenwich Time. This action abolished the awkward two and one-half hour difference in time between the islands and the west coast of the mainland.

"It put Hawaiian Standard Time on an on-the-hour conformity with mainland time. Hawaiian Standard Time is now an even two hours behind Pacific Coast Standard Time and five hours behind New York and Eastern Standard Time.

"The change was made by the 1947 Legislature upon the recommendation of the Governor.

THIS WEEK'S SPECIAL DXES

- CW-43-A** Tacuarembó, Uruguay. Here is a DX program which may well add a new country to your logs. This station has agreed to present this program for our clubs, and will use 1,500 watts - power enough to get through to the states, if the channel is clear, and if conditions are right. We doubt that CW-43-A has ever been heard in this country, so to log and verify them will be a real thrill. Address: Sr. Luis S. Dini - Divisora Zorrilla de San Martín - 18 de Julio 310 - Tacuarembó, Uruguay. South America. Arranged NNRC.
- WAOV** Vincennes, Indiana. This program will immediately follow WAOV's regularly-scheduled frequency check, and will be especially for us DXers of the NNRC and the NRC. WAOV has long been a familiar stand-by of the DX scene, and has always maintained a very friendly attitude toward those who like to tune for distant stations. We thank Mr. Edward Wallace of WAOV for agreeing to remain on the air after finishing the check program, in order to make this special show available for the DXers. Arranged by the NNRC.
- WEUS** Eustis, Florida. A very new station is WEUS, and it seems that only a few ought preliminary test broadcasts from them. So here we all have a great opportunity of adding them to our heard logs. The station is very much interested in its DX coverage, and is very desirous of receiving reports from all over, to check their directional array and sky wave. This frequency should be clear from coast to coast for this broadcast, so that all will have a good chance of logging WEUS. Thanks go to Mr. Frank W. Stebbins (NNRC)
- KFRO** Longview, Texas. Again a clear channel is envisioned in the States, but of course KHON, Honolulu, will still be on. However, no trouble is expected, and KFRO should ride through all over the nation. This program is their regular frequency check, and KFRO would like also to have a check-up on their sky-wave and coverage. For this program, we extend the hand-clasp of thanks to Mr. James R. Curtis, President of KFRO, who has agreed to dedicate this check to the DX clubs and their members. Arranged by the NNRC.
- WKXK** Saginaw, Michigan. Here is a "sunshine" station not heard very often at distant points. This special test will afford us that rare chance of logging this station. WKXK too, should have a clear channel, and with their 1,000 watts, and non-directional antenna, they should roll in for DXers everywhere. Mr. Max W. Thomas, Chief Engineer, is very anxious to have a complete check on the radiation of WKXK, and enlists the help of the DX fraternity on this test. Thank you, Mr. Thomas! Arranged by the NNRC.
- WIDS** Jacksonville, Illinois. Another old and familiar radio station, WIDS, dedicates a test to our clubs. We are not certain of the exact time of the test, but it has been reported to be 2:30 to 3:00 a.m., which is the time they hold their frequency check, on the first Friday, and also 3:30 to 4:00. We should imagine the former time is the correct one, but we're not sure. Channel should be clear both times. Mr. G.J. Carsons, C.E. will look for your reports, and WIDS has every report ever received, valuing them highly. NNRC.
