WMT & KCRG PRESENT DXERS AT IOWA GET-TOGETHER

These two programs will be fitting high-lights to the fine 1947-1948 DX season. At Cedar Rapids, Iowa, on the week-end of April 10 and 11, the mid-western DXers will gather and have a small-scale convention, but one which has been well-planned, and one which none who attend will ever forget. They will have a dinner at the Hotel Montrose, and there, Mr. James Hollis of the Collins Radio Company will speak about radio transmission, antennas, etc., and then, another feature of this get-together will be the cutting of two hour-long transcriptions, one at the WMT studios, and the other at the KCRG studios. The party will visit each station and have a chance to look around and see how they operate. On each of these programs, you will all have a chance to hear your fellow-members who got to this get-together, and those who were there will be able to hear how they themselves sound on the radio. There will be music on the programs, too, and maybe interviews, and we also expect to hear a lot about the gathering as well. Now, remember, these will be delayed broadcasts - they'll be made over the week-end of the Iowa party, and will be repeated at an hour when DX fans everywhere will have a grand opportunity of hearing them. WMT's program will be heard on April 14, from 4:00 to 5:00 a.m., E.S.T., and KCRG will put theirs on on April 19, at the same hour. Both stations are expected to encounter a nationally clear channel, and should be heard on both coasts, and at all points in between. It will be KCRG's first DX program ever, and WMT has not had such a program in many years. Now both stations are going to quite some expense to bring us these transcribed DX programs, and it is up to us to support them by listening and even more important, by reporting to them. Both stations are also interested in how they get out on this program. For KCRG, send your reports to Mr. George Biggar, Manager, and for WMT, reports should be sent to Mr. George Hixenbaugh, Chief Engineer. Mr. William B. Quarton, Manager of WMT, gave the OK for this show, and our thanks go out to Mr. Biggar and to Mr. Quarton for these two unique programs. Even though our DX contest will have been completed by the dates of these two broadcasts, please - no one - fail to send in a report, and don't forget to thank these gentlemen for what they have done not only to help make a howling success this Iowa Convention, but for providing two hours of real pleasure to all DX fans, who of course love to hear a DX program with real DXers on it. Many whose reports you read here will be on the air, so listen, by all means, to WMT&KCRG.
