Well, missed a couple of bulletins but I've been really tied up with school and odds and ends here and there. Plenty of DX, however. Lots of reports sent out in the past couple of weeks and a fair number of varies back. First of all, in response to Ted Saling's comment on my comments, let me repeat that the band is still plenty cluttered up with late signers, all nighters and other miscellaneous pests, hi. Daylight Time has helped only very slightly - the biggest help has been KPNO and KPCN leaving 24-hour schedule, thus freeing 1240. ***** DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME RETURNS *****
 Ralph Johanne sends us a clipping from the AP listing states observing Daylight Saving Time, in most cases beginning April 25, and ending September 26. This is of interest to DXers, as station schedules will vary an hour in those states.

States to observe Daylight Time:

MAINE - NEW HAMPSHIRE - VERMONT - MASSACHUSETTS - RHODE ISLAND - CONNECTICUT - NEW YORK
 NEW JERSEY - DELAWARE - PENNSYLVANIA - MARYLAND - ILLINOIS - CALIFORNIA - NEVADA.

Portions of these will observe Daylight Time:

TENNESSEE - WEST VIRGINIA - MICHIGAN - MISSOURI - OHIO - INDIANA - VIRGINIA and possibly parts of FLORIDA.

These will not observe Daylight Saving Time:

ARIZONA - IDAHO - WASHINGTON - OREGON - UTAH - COLORADO - WYOMING - NEW MEXICO - MONTANA
 KENTUCKY - LOUISIANA - MISSISSIPPI - ARKANSAS - ALABAMA - GEORGIA - SOUTH CAROLINA
 NORTH CAROLINA - OKLAHOMA - TEXAS - KANSAS - NEBRASKA - IOWA - MINNESOTA - SOUTH DAKOTA
 NORTH DAKOTA - WISCONSIN. (Ed. note - No mention is made of Washington, D.C.)

This means stations in Daylight zones will sign on an hour earlier and will sign off an hour earlier in relation to Standard Time. Some Standard Time stations will thus be easier to hear before their sign-offs, while Daylight Time stations will be on an hour sooner, and thus will be easier to hear than during the winter, theoretically at least, if it is not daylight when they come on. The picture changes, and gives summer-time DX fans chances to hear stations they can't get during the winter months. (Thanks, Ralphie!)

Well, a few more veries in since last bulletin and they are letters from WDWD - WAYN for my Jan. 1947 report on their DX and it's a very fine letter and definite verie. Also WENA KUGR WILM WLAM for their long ago DX, WVWR, the now deleted call in Albany, N.Y., KOLC KOJM, and cards from WJPD CJCA WEIR CKEW for their DX. Total now 1383. Also received dup veries from WWL & WGIV. Reports went out to 3/28 - KWAD, 3/29 - WCDT, 4/1 - WFLO WYRA, 4/5 - KSIW-dx KOTX on f/c, 4/9 - WTAO WBTH WBLK KPJB WMEU on 1340 Kc/s. who comes in Buffalo very good now that WEEA is off that frequency. Tried for CKOX in Woodstock, but WJRO too strong here days and in the evenings the 1340 channel is one big mess. Had swell visit from Steve Mann who stopped off here on his way home from Toronto. Come again, Steve. Also received the new edition of Art Hoarster's log and it's very welcome. This time I marked the stations needed instead of those verified. Made the job much easier although there were a good number to be marked. (Wotsis? Ralphie heard CKOX all OK in the afternoon ???? Methinks Pop is slipping???? - Ed.)

Well, it looks like spring is here. I didn't get any DXing in during March, so the shock was terrific when I heard the loud silence on some of the old noisy channels! I twirled the band until 4:00 on 4/5 and until 4:30 on 4/9 as I am on spring vacation. I couldn't pull KKOD through on their DX but I did pull through a few smatterings of KSIW. The latter was really rugged as WIAW down in Weston, W. Va., decided to f/c with R.C.A. at 3:45 and another carrier, perhaps theirs, intermittently wrecked the first half of KSIW's program (or should I call it a test, hi.) WAPX had a swell all-club show this morning. I reported the entire program. It looks like I fouled up on that KCJB BCE frequency. Probably was 935 rather than 974. The calibrations on the Zenith aren't any too good. I thought I had WAAT on one side of him, though. I can't give a listing of recent veries as they are in Cleveland and I am at home in Wellsville, Ohio. The total as of 4/2 was 132. One of my holdout states has been Kansas.
