Mel Oliver - Houston, Texas.

DX season is over here, but since last report marks have been received from WAYN KTAE KIOA KXCI KXMM WSPG WVIK KQAR KQWJ KQFB, with reports out to KLOU KIOX KJOH WINZ WCNU KSIW KHRB & KQVO. Veries not total 501, so have a long way to go to get in the upper brackets. However, with the new SX-42 now on hand, should have a good season next fall, something I didn't have this year. Antenna is quite poor, but am planning on building onto my house soon, with a radio den to be included, and will put up an improved antenna before this fall. Local KQOH on 1430 will take the air for regular schedule 5/5/48 after long last. Will ber all hillbilly and swing music, and with commercials read in a quiet voice with background music -- quite a contrast to some stations in this vicinity. Believe KXNL in Dallas has a similar policy. Suppose FM stations are classed as SW, but the SX-42 picks them up here as far away as Harlingen - 300 miles away. Reports sent out since April 1 went to WOPJ WILX WAPX WKLA WMT KCRG WRUN KJSK WWNH WPAQ and last but not least to WBRL (the new 500 watter in Beloit, Wis., which was heard on May 16 at 3:30 a.m., E.S.T.). These underlined have verified so far. WUNR came through with a yellow card printed in black; WILX verified with a swell card showing all of the Great Lakes on a map with the various industries and sports of Michigan and Wisconsin. WOPJ & WKLA verified by letter, as did KJSK. KCRG confirmed on a penny post-card and WPAQ verified by letter. At the present, an unusual network set-up exists here. WBN broadcasts all the night games of the Dodgers, I don't know about the day games, as I can't get them in the daytime. (They handle all Dodger games -El.) One more item - WJOW, 1250, York, Pa. expect to be getting on the air in about a month so be on the lookout for their tests. Willis Weaver is their CE. Missings of the MembersRandolph Hunt - Berkeley, California

As usual Herb Campbell had interesting report, the "broken-down" results of past season's DX'ing. My results have not been any too good. On specials from KTMS, KIST, KIEV & KCVW veries probably would not be in yet except for follow-ups consisting of carbon of original report and more return postage, average time out 86 days. KCV is out 133 days, a poor showing for Calif. The following specials have not been heard from, they have received carbon copies and more 3¢ stamps, WNEC for DX of Jan. 18th, WGRD for DX'es of Jan. 20th and repeat on Feb. 9th. KGLZ for theirs of March 8th, and KVAN of Feb 2nd. Of the 37 specials I wrote only two or three were farther into some state than present veries, therefore of little or no value, just wrote to support club contest and work of CPO, all in all I have found that type of veries sent for specials are inferior to those sent out by stations on with P/C or regular program. Other reports sent out and replies long past due are, ZONA, KQUT, KGLF, KXAL, WCCO, KMAR none of these asked for reports when I heard them. KQXX is out since last Nov. 14th they asked for reports from Calif. and KMMV testing Feb. 25th said "if you hear us, let us hear from you" The score for the season, those with specials no replies from 6 of 37, others written were 57 and no replies from 6. It is May 29th in Calif. last Saturday none other than Joe Stokes and wife were here at the shack, she said that WJCA is right in her mother's backyard. Need I say that Joe Stokes and Ed Lippe had DX program on KQFA along about 1932 for a verie I told them that if the program was being carried over W9XX that a verie was not in order, they verified. I have 3 veries from KZEM and on each report I said if program is also on SW do not verify. To me any station on both ECB and SW is a short wave station and any verification received for a program being sent out both ECB and SW is a SW verie! Once I asked an expert of Latin Americans, "What is to keep a DX'er from hearing a station faintly on ECB switching to SW frequency copying the SW and sending in a report for ECB veries" the reply was, "Nothing, they do it all the time"

As all of you know, the purpose of this little gathering will be to transfer the publishing job over to Harold, he will also assume Pops office of Executive Secretary and all in all he will operate the National Radio Club from his home. Route # 1 North Girard, Penna. He will collect all dues and handle all the financial end. So anyone sending Dues after June 12th please send them direct to Harold. The Club Headquarters will remain in BUFFALO N.Y. at least for the present, so have no fear that your Letter Heads or Report Forms will be useless in so far as the heading is concerned. It was agreed that the Club HQ would not change at least for 6 months AFTER our last Letter heads and Forms are sold. This was done so that we can sell the remainder of our stock, so it is suggested that those of you who use them, order them this summer. We have 250 Forms left and about 1200 letter heads. Remember they are OK because no change in CLUB HQ will take place as stated above. They are 65¢ per 100 for Letter heads and 75¢ per 100 for Report Forms, postpaid.

I would like to thank each and every NRC member for the splendid support they have accorded me during the past 7-1/2 years. Had it not been for your cooperation and support the National Radio Club could not and would not have continued. As most of you will remember that back in October 1940 the Club was just about non-existence, today we are established both in membership and financially.
