I thinkthat ary station on with apecial should have roply back to roporter within not more than 30 dage, if a big station like WIIC, medium like KGER, and ary manber of 250 watters can do it, why not all of them? of the 32 specials that varified, 24 did 30 with an averago of 13 days, the other 8 had an average of 76 days, of the 32 specials varifled 12 were 250 watters. Receiver used was 10 -year-sld Hemarlund HQ-120. Only verie received too late for contest was KDKA, a rather neat card and improvement over post oard of some 17 years ago. In those days I tried for atation in asah atate, a low-powor job if poseible, in Ponnsylvanis soon after KDZA I verified WAZL then 100 watts - never did get a lowor powered station ary farther in U.D. The greatent distance and lowest power for foreigner was 470 with 200 watts - this one was of real interest as some 8 or 10 years before I was on a ship that put in at Townaville for a cargo of frozen beef consigred to U.S. Aruy at Nanile. Ere this, the CPC's of NRC \& WRRC have recoived letter aigned by mary DXers in the West in protest of eastern DXes starting bofore PST etations have ligned, doing so handicaps the western DXer and is not fair to stations, eapecially whan thay ere thrown on the afr to buck a PST station and told that thay should bo hoard from coset to coast.
