It has been ouch a long time since I have sent in a line to the club - in fact, none aince you took over. I don't know what the excuse is, unases it has been that $I$ have been too buay sending out reception reports to talce time out to write. I to always onjoy reading what all of the other boys are doing, and since you made such an appesi for reports this time I'll send one along. In the past 13 months, I have verified almost 400 stations in all of the 46 states, the Islande and Canada. I do not bothar with Cuba and Maxico or the South Arcericans as I find it a waste of money to write tham (maybe not so for Maloy.) A DXer should slways be resourceful and obeerving, for in that way, his log grows, and his verifications will include several eye-openers which will wake lesa fortunate DXers glow at least a olight pink around the gille. Another itec of graat importance is a rap which shows the amaller cities, for by it you will be able to follow the course of a hurricane. In othar words, if you see Mismi is threatened by a harricano, you will then know that Coral Gables and Fort Leuderdale's stations will probably also be on, for they are very near by to Miami. This also comes in handy when trying to plot the course of a mid-south-western tornade. Fe recommend the map which "Broadcasting" puts out for, I believe, 75p. This map lists every oity and town in the U.S.A., its possessions, and Canada, having a radio station on the standard broadcast band. Another thing which can help is the bourly news broadeasts on several of the all-night stations. If anything big is happening, you'll hear about it firsthand, and you can then tune for stations in the aroa or sreas mentioned. So let us all. abide by the Golden Rule and I am sure that no one will. be sorry.

Secondly as was the procedure last season, releases will. only be issued once a month if necessary. If something very important comes up a release will be sent immediately.

Sra. No release will be send from this Office that will. involve the spending of the Club Funds, unless the proposal has been OKed by the Clubs Executive Secretary. The reason for this is that the Exec. Sec is solely responsible for Club Funds and it is his responsibility to see to it that the Club is always in good financial condition and that there is sufficient funds on hand to insure a continuous issuing of our bulletins.
