Herb Campbell - Athens, Pennsylvania

Bob Duggen - Atlanta, Georgia After going all over the Pacific early this year in the Navy, I returned to two weeks' duty in the Mayal Reserve, visiting Bermuda, the first part of September. Have at last settled down now, though, studying Electrical Engineering at Georgia Tech. WERD "The Good Word Station" is regular now. WSB-TV began regular achedule last night with a big show. (Thank Bob, and success at Ga. Tech! Your reports look good again! -Ed.)

Murrey Lamont - Dunedin, New Zealand I have ereicted a new antenna 1,000 feet long, 16 feet high, single wire, but so far have only reported KXXX and KDSX testing at 2:00 a.m., E.S.T. September 19. Petrol is still rationed so DX suffers. Only veries recently are 4YC and 4XD, local call changes on Sept. 1. I have been a DXer for about 10 years. Perhaps you would be interested in a few details of my log - Total, 503, made up 65 214 K's, 121 W's, 19 Canadians, 9 Maxicans, 5 Indians, 10 AFRS stations, mostly closed down now in Pacific and Japan, and the rest are N.Z. and Australian. I think two of my most prized veries are WINS & WHN, both powerful but no one else in N.Z. has heard them. I notice most members of NRC prefer letter-heads to cards. I'm just the opposite. I like cards much better, the prettier, more so, of course, but any sort really. I have been down to the shack a few times lately and the change of frequency of our stations seems to be very good as far as we are concerned. > POLICE RADIO DISPATCHER BY DAY PURSUES 'DX' HOBBY AT NIGHT (re-printed from BUFFALO EVENING NEWS, 9/22/48.)

"Doesn't he every go to bed?" aske puzzled Shirley Ave. residents. Few of them know that "night owl" Eaymond B. Edge, 46, of 325 Shirley Ave., WMJ police radio dispatcher, is merely relaxing at his hobby after a day's radio 'casting. Mr. Edge is a "DXer" - one of a group of 600 in the United States and abroad.

"DX stands for distance unknown," explains Mr. Edge, "Night and early-morning hours are best for long-distance reception. Our peak listening months extend from October to April. "Summer he an ideal time for almost everything but DXing. Static caused by sun spots and dust often makes reception difficult. I tune to a station, copy part of the broadcast, listen for call letters, then write the station requesting verification," he contimed.

Mr. Edge has received 1450 acknowledgements since he began "DXing" in 1928. He has a scrapbook in which he keeps verification letters. He has tuned to 141 foreign stations and New York leads his United States list with 80 stations. Texas is second

Mr. Edge's radio is a 23-tube custom-built receiver. He is an officer of the National Radio Club, composed of more than 200 "DXers."

TIMELY TIPS OWN TUNING TOUGHIES IV - "THE PERSON QUARTER."

Yes, the football season is once again upon us, and again, it influences DX, at least a little. With two major league Football groups operating, and with several teams on the West Coast, and with several games to be played at night, very often that last quarter of the game may be heard for goodly distances! And often, when an Eastern team is playing bil the far west, the station back home also carries the event, giving DXers the chance of catching them. Now that also applies to night college games, and sometimes it also means that a daytime station will be given special permission to remain on the air in the evenings with the description of the game, so it might be a good idea to have a look at your Friday paper's sports pages for such Friday night games, and also for Saturday night games. Now, as the football season wanes and fades, the basketball season comes upon the scene, and again, there are frequent games on the air later than the usual schedule of the stations. In basketball, almost all the games are at night. with the accent on Friday nights and Saturday nights. Remember there are professional leagues here, too, as well as myriads of college games. Some stations in small towns scattimes even broadcast high school basketball games, so be on the watch for them. One way of identifying the station is by listening for the names of the teams playing. then consulting your Art Foerster Esdic Log for stations in that town. And, then in Canada, hockey will be getting under way in a few weeks, and that means more broadcasts for you to be on the alert for. Toward the end of the hockey season -that is along abdut March - the big play-off games, if tied, go into extra periods, until some one scores, and there again, you have a wonderful opportunith of catching a seldom-heard station. Canadian stations are also heard on late fromtime to time with curling matches. Be a sporte-lover and a DXer, then, at the same time! NEXT WEEK - ROAR, AURORA, ROAR!
