### "DX NEWS" Musings of the Members

Al Barthofffley - Coming, New York

High time I have a resume of last season's DXing, now that new season is under way. Will try to drop a eard to Wagner each week intime for DX Down the Dial, Note in letters of a lot of members of their hearing stations on the graveyard channels that are needed by lots of us . they make no mention whether it was a frequency check, or time heard - puly stat they were cought or that verification received. Every f/c I hear will forward in to Wagner and wish others would do the same. DN of 1947-1948 season: Didn't start unvil Nov. 19, and sent reports to 214 new stations, up until middle of May when I coased for season. Of the 219 reported to, 26 have thus far failed to roply, some after repeated follow-ups. too. Those failing to veply include only 3 "K" calls - KOLN KCOH KOOL. WORA & WOMN in Puerto Rico; HOX on special, ditto XEPK & WGRD. Balame, not too worried. Found past season one of poorest from a standpoint of distant reception in years, with the exception of the early part of April. High noise level all winter with planty of atmospheric buzzing noise and coesters noted for their absance. As a result only a few 2000 milers added here. Nearly every state is represented in my verifications but am ashamed to say I passed up a lot of "W" calls and tried for "K" calls mostly. For instance, of all the new ones on in my own state, I only adied 2 veries from N,Y. last season. Probably the cream of the crop of my veries are the following: KAWT KWAK KUCB KURA KSEW THEN KUBC KRIN KDSH KRPL FBIO KSWI KXIC KSMN KICA KCLO KEUS KSYL KSIG KWAD KAUS KFMO KISK KULT KRAM KASH KSYC KRAL KTRI KOPE KOAT KSIW KEYE KIMC, and on a follow-up. from a season ago, KWCO. Most of these came back promptly with exception of a few, including KWAD, who however finally relented this fall with a nice card verie. The big state bast season was Taxas where 22 new ones were added and all verified but above-mentioned KTOH. Best of Texans were KEPO KELP KHIT KXIT KLWT. Washington gave me 4, including KYAK & KWRT, the original call of KXRN, a 250-watter in Renton on 1220. Very pleased to get that one as I bolieve KVRT call only used a short time. Best "W" catches were WWNH on first test, who by the way answered promptly but took three tries to get a definite verie. WAMS WFAU WGUY WLAM & WEGE also adied. Only 5 new Canadians edded last season: CKOK CKEW CHVC CFRA CKCL, to bring total to 141 verified. Puerto Rico sent me 6 with 2 still out - WPBP. WITA WIBS WAPA WENI & WEAB. Hawali gave me 2 - KMVI & KHON. Fndei season with 1746 veries and only really outstanding ones from my viewpoint were KWRT & CKOK, heard through the Spanish-speaker after California signed. (Welcome back to the NRC, Al, and also welcome once again to these pages! Here's hopping for weakly reports! -Ed.) Ted Weiser - Schwylkill Haven, Pennsykvania
