In the lands below our border, Christmas Eve is A big party, which lasts far into the morning of Christmas, and mary mary stations stay on right along with the festivities. It is amazing how many Spanish-apeaking stations you can hear on Christmas morning, and also some very low-powered ones! The Cubans are usually finished by 3:00 or 4:00, while the Costa Ricans go on later. Tha South Americans, particularly in Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador and Pera, seam to run all night lorg. Go af ter tha weakest onss, as a hint, for not only are they the more rare, but are more likely to verify. They are thrilled by the fact that they have been hoard all tho way up here, you see. The Cuban programis consist of their typicsl music, with a rather high-pitched fife-like inotrument predominating. Around Guatamala, the marimbs's tones are familiar. The South Amaricans' musio is usually rhunbes, tangos, sambas, boleros, and the liks. The programis are generally live, and norrimant and appleuse can be heard in the background. So - be on the alert - sit up and waft for Santa Claus and listen to acme of these excellent DX catioces. Send your reports in Spanish, and include, if you can, postage of that country, or an Ifnternationsl Haply Coupon, which you may purchase at your local post office for 11 each. Also, lookfor late prograste from American stations, many broadcesting Midnight Wess. The Mutual netorrk carries the St. Patifick's Cathedral kasa, and you might $\log$ a couple of graveyard MBS stations signing off after this sarvice. Other networke too, stay on a bit late but not so late as to epoil your Latin-American DXing.
