Musings of the Members
Sid Steele - Charleston, Ill.

I don't get around to writing very often - but I'm still in there DXing when I can get the time. I ran out of report forms a couple of weeks ago and have really missed them. When I first bought them I did not think I would use them often, but I found myself using them all the time - partly to save time. Reception has been poor here for over a week. Was up this morning (1/29) and got WCLA OK because he's in the south, but had little luck with WVEC. I logged a couple of selections but did not get any announcements. May not have been them. We've had a lot of local buzzes which are slowly driving me crazy. The strongest one is somewhat intermittent, so I can sneak in a few seconds now and again. Even KIOA this morning was not above buzz level. I have been trying for several months to get an answer out of KIOA - hope they come through this time. Was pleased to get CJCJ and CBI this season. I was sorry to see CJCJ go to 1,000 watts - a 100 watt verie would look better. I have CFAO and CJOC on 100 watts, but never connected with CJCJ. The bulletins are always a pleasure to read and I know I express the views of all the members by sincerely thanking Hal Wagner for carrying on Ray's job. It is very much appreciated.

Bernie Duffy - ~~xxx xxx - xxxxxx~~ Staten Island, NY.

Mentioning most important things first, I begin this week's report by expressing sincere appreciation to Ted Weiser for his helpful tips that the weak newscaster and Hawaiian tunes/cff themes I heard behind WWSW at 2:55-3:03 recently was rare catch, KICO. I received my first DX premium the other day when the "Balinese Room" of Galveston, Texas, sent me two fancy decks of playing cards, as the result of my reporting having heard the orchestra of that night spot via KGBC (who sent me a poorly-typed postal verie, that even omitted better calls.) Being unable to understand Spanish I take Mel Oliver's word for it that the Spanish-speaker I heard on 1060 Kc/s/ Feb. 3 till 3:05 a.m. was CMCM, that he heard with same particulars several recent mornings. My recent veries are printed cards from KRGV KSFT & CKCO, nice letters from WKSR WABI & KGYN - the latter advised that they have an f/c the 3rd Sunday, at 2:00-2:15 a.m., E.S.T. and that they got about 200 reports on their original tests. Feb. 3rd, I found WVEZ testing at 3:00-3:15 and WVOK doing the same on the identical channel of 690 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour later; a tester appealing for reports and promising veries at 3:29 on 1490 kilocycles behind WWSW - maybe WDLF. KROX too weak to report and WMAZ in the clear on 940 kilocycles at 3:45. WOR was silent. Feb. 6th, "The All-Night Record Man" apparently of seldom-identifying CFRG, topped all else on 1490 Kc/s from 3:45-5:45 a.m. During that two hour period I only caught one announcement on that Canadian, that spoke of everything but the calls between each "platter." WWXL for the first time easily topped XEMC at 4:00-5:30 Feb. 7th, unlike all recent unsuccessful tries for KLCU's monthly tests I found their interesting and widely-reported by phone DX-case loud and steady - they remained on till 4:03 a.m. WCYB s/off at 3:38 from its test (apparently each first Monday.) A weak-sigaled concert-orchestra station on 1450 Kcs. at 3:28-3:30 that might have been KSVP. WTCO's (identity only) test came in good at 3:15-3:30. Once again I was unable to raise WEUS's montly test, as a result I won't bother looking for that elusive Florida station any more. At 2:30 that morning I heard what seemed to be a weakish Spanish-speaker on 1450 Kc/s. - anyone know who it was? WNEW was silent that morning.

Exactly two new ones heard here this week: WULA on his regular f/c on 2/3 and KTAT's DX-test of 2/6. Sure glad to get this one as WKBW blocks 1570 for me when on and he was silent (except for testing after and blocking part of KTAT's program) ##### for me. Both above stations came in fairly well, WULA had a musical program following his check. New veries came from WEKR KXOA KRUZ WIRJ KIRO & KGYN, all nice letters. A typed card from WVNJ and a nice card from KSFT who was told not to reply, only sent him a report on signal and thank-you. WEKR evidently checks on the fourth Tuesday at 3:30 a.m. E.S.T. but runs an interesting program from 3:00 to 3:30 featuring the Tennessee Tune-Twisters, led by Ernest "George Washington" Tucker, Assistant C.E. who answered the report. KGYN's f/c is on the Third Sunday, 2:00 to 2:15 a.m., E.S.T. KSIJ seems to check every Sunday, 5:15 to 5:30, and usually has music for 15 minutes before that. WING'S all-night show is evidently limited to Sunday mornings now, the only morning when WHBQ is silent. All for now - 73's.

My report to XERX brought some results in the form of a magazine called "Irapuato", but nothing resembling a verie. Printed card from KDHL says, "This will acknowledge receipt of your recent communication. KDHL is happy to have reports of reception and thanks you for your interest. Your letter will be given full consideration, and then filed at KDHL's offices." A new angle here - what would you call it? Reports sent KPRO CKHF CMBH WMAZ KGAX KXOW KBOR KTXN & KCTI, with veries this week from CMHX WWXL WWSO WIRK KSGN KGST WNAG WIRJ WGAU WRAR KGYN WMT and certificate from WGOV. WWYL verie says they're on all Saturday night, and KGYN says their regular f/c is third Sunday from 3:00 to 3:15. Also mentioned that they received over 200 reports on their ET's, including 7 from New Zealand. Fully intended hearing Ken Albrecht's DX from KLOU this morning, but my alarm clock quit shortly after I retired, so I didn't hear anything this morning until 7:00. Last Monday's mail brought 8 veries, my best day this season. Five today would give me an even 600. Not too much logged lately. 2/1, KFCO on test asking for reports, WGOV ditto, WGPA on test. 2/2 - WTCM on top of 1400 Kc/s. over WKAL, WHBQ, WATW ditto, WNAG topping WWSW for quite a while. 2/3 - WROD on top of 1340 Kc/s.; logged KQVE near sign-off for new one, WUIA pushing WBIR around, WMEV really tops over WINS 3:28 to 4:00 a.m. 2/4, WDLB back of WWSW not too good this time on their second f/c 2/6 - WRNY-DX logged quite a bit over WITH, KTAT on test with fine program, 1490 crowded. WCUM heard on top of WWSW, then WATO, CFRC back of WWSW, WVOK on brief test, WQXR ditto at 5:10-5:20 a.m., WNEB on f/c at 6:30 fairly heard back of WITH. Daytime reception very good ~~###~~ today, logging WSM WLAC in Nashville at noontime, WKEW and WCKY very good too ditto on WRBA and WWVA. Sent follow-up on WEOV, in the clear here daytime, daytime report to WHGB, local and tops on 1400 over WEST. ZNS heard in the clear 2/2 8:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., very good signal, S-9, QRK-5. Help wanted - verie-signers for WKUL WFRP WMRC WLVA and WHIT.

Eldon Addy - Marcus, Iowa

With the continued cold weather here, DXing has still been poor with only KNOG, 1340 Kc/s., Nogales, Arizona on his Monday f/c 3:00-3:20 E.S.T. f/c. Tuesday, WIRJ on ET on 740 Kc/s. QRM'd by WJIG. Nothing new Wednesday, and Thursday KVVG, 1590 Kc/s., Ventura, Calif. An regular from 2:30 to 2:45 a.m. on top of the Mexican. Friday: KXOA on his new channel of 1470 Kc/s. on top most of time over the Mexican on his channel. Nothing new Saturday though KBOR on 1600 Kc/s. was testing. This Sunday A.M. heard the swell DX show from KTAT on 1570 Kc/s. Fell asleep at 4:45 and didn't wake up till 7:00 so missed the DX from WCON. However a Thank-You card sent. Gee! Neither WKDN nor KVOS was heard here and the reception both mornings was fairly good. Wonder if anyone did hear these two? If no one heard KVOS he may possibly come on in March again. Sell veries received from KTOW WNAG KVEN KGYN KLOK KNOG WEED and Joe Becker note: WEED for f/c of Jan. 24, signed by C. C. ~~###~~ Worsley, C.E. and states reports are always welcome from DXers. I have noted in my follow-ups to stations the answer always comes back saying "Your original report was mis-placed or lost in the office." So it really does pay to send a follow-up and always include return postage. Best of DX to all.

Len Kruse - Dubuque, Iowa

The past week's weather conditions have caused poor radio reception. No sign of DXes from either KVOS or KSGN. However, a swell DX program was broadcast from KTAT on 2/6, with a total of 18 entertainers, on the show. Station WAND (900) Canton, Ohio, logged on Sunday, 2/6 with regular schedule 7:30-7:45 a.m., Enjoyed listening to Ken Albrecht's KLOU DX till 4:00 a.m. on 2/7. Among many calls received on program were two DXers - calls from Herz and Mustoe. Logged WEUS (790) Eustis, Florida, on f/c 2/7 3:40-3:50. Among veries of late was a letter from WMON for a report of 10/28-46 and no follow-up was sent, either. Among other veries were, all letters, WVAR-DX WWSO-DX KGYN KCNC KTEC CKCQ, and a card from WJJI.

The Feb. 20 and Feb. 27 dates for WIND & WCON, respectively, are re-schedules from the original listings. Be sure to mark these dates down as musts for these two programs.

Robert Base - Baltimore, Maryland

In October, 1932, I heard 68 new stations which was my best total for one month until January of this year when I was able to make it 71. The peculiar weather conditions which have prevailed through January have been some help and I made good use of the NRC sign-off time-table. As I was mainly interested in trying to beat my former total for one month, I did not try to verify any but those heard on DX broadcasts and often only a brief part of an announcement was heard in the jumble of other stations of an back of a more powerful near-by station. I made two lists of possible stations to receive - one North and West, the other South, according to the way conditions prevailed. Then I usually sat down and read the paper between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. with earphones on and set the dial to various spots where a needed stations might be heard. Of course the hour will have to be advanced each month but it was quite a help in adding a number of new calls to my list. Toward the end of the month it was a matter of listening to Dubans or South Americans or nothing. Good thing I don't care much about radio programs as some nights there is hardly a clear spot except for locals but that's all the better for DX and that's about all I care about on the radio anyway. I have found the nightly weather map telecast at 7:00 p.m. on WNBW Washington very interesting as it often will explain why the South will predominate one time and the North another or the rare occasions when both prevail according to the fronts of the map. Incidentally I thought it might be nice to have the WNBW-TV verification, to put alongside of the old WNBW of Carbondale, Pa. so copied the weather map for a reception report one night. It looks like it is the same thing with television as BCB because as yet I have not received any answer. Has anyone received a verification from CKOW's DX? I don't bother too much with follow-ups but when I see that everyone else gets an answer I begin to think mine may be overlooked. I sent a card to this effect to WROY and had a nice letter back by return mail saying that they never received any report from me. Of course I sent another report taken from my note book but letters do get lost in the mail sometimes and this should be considered before judging a station. I have 1647 heard and hope to reach 2000 by the end of 1950. The proposed new frequency check list will be a big help if it can be gotten out before this season is over.
