W C E D Du Bois, Pennsylvania This will be a special DX program, not a test, and it will come at a time when 1230 is rather crowded. We hope that some of you, however, will be able to dig through WITH, WCPO, KLAS, KXXL, and any others and

W N B H New Bedford, Massachusetts WNBH, as most of you know, is one of the oldest stations on the air, and they have long been a DXer's friend. WNBH, too, will encounter all-nighter interference, from WEXL, WHHM, and KRUX,

X E B I Aguascalientes, Ags., Mexico Here's a rare one which should be on a clear channel. Address: Madero 92, Apartado 146, Aguascalientes. XEBI is known as "Radio Central" and will probably use 1,000 watts. Sr. Rivas asks that let-

1360 ters be sent "immediately upon receipt of our signal," so don't delay writing in after the program. Arranged by the NNRC.

W H A I Greenfield, Massachusetts This will be on a Monday morning, so that only WEDC should be in the way of a clear channel for this special program. WHAI too, has long been a DX land-mark, and they have always been happy to

1240 hear from us. We hope that a goodly number of you will be successful in tuning in this special DX program. Arranged by the NNRC.

W L N H Laconia, New Hampshire This is a station and state needed by a good many DX fans, but logging WLNH may have its difficulties. Again WEXL, WHHM, KRUX and WHAT will team up with West Coast stations to make it on the difficult side. However, WLNH is well worth straining for, so

1340 everybody be on 1340 to have a try, anyhow. Arranged by the NNRC.

W E W Saint Louis, Missouri WEW states they are the oldest commercial station west of the Mississippi, having opened in 1921. Owned by St. Louis University, where that excellent basket-ball team comes from, they will have a spec-

770 ial test program at this time. KXA will also be on this channel then, and again promptness is important in getting your report in the mail. Info: L. KRUSE

K I R X Kirksville, Missouri This is a new station, as compared to the ones listed above, and this will be a special DX program - their first ever. WWDC will be on to spoil the act for some, but we imagine they will cut

1450 through pretty well. We hope they experience good reception, and will have a nice batch of reports to show for their efforts. Arranged by the NNRC.

***** And this will be the last page of this type until next September or October, for we reach the traditional end of the DX season with March 31. However, there is much DX to be heard if the members will tune in from time to time during the wee hours of the warmer months. Often we have run into a nice, brisk, cold night, and have felt as we got up to turn the radio on that reception is going to be excellent, only to find it very noisy and signals weak. Conversely, on some summer mornings, with the heat hanging overhead, one has gone to the radio, figuring reception is going to be noisy and impossible, and have found it instead, quite quiet and reception unbelievably good. Of course such mornings are a bit on the rare side, but it might be a good idea to try, for if some new daytime stations or grave-yard stations conduct their equipment tests then, you might otherwise never get a chance to hear that station.

"We are in receipt of your letter of the 27th inst., re: very infrequent station identifications.

"Please be advised that we have checked our station log and find that the programme you mentioned on 1320 Kc/s. is not ours and that we are glad to hear that we are not the only station on the air with the all too infrequent breaks.

"You mentioned an 'ad' of some eatery in your letter. It might be of interest to you that we have no commercial rights and our broadcasts are entirely sustaining in nature. We who run the station are all undergraduate electrical engineers here at Queen's University and operate more for the enjoyment we get out of it than anything else. We have regular scheduled programmes Wednesdays 7-10, Fridays 7-12 and Saturdays 7-06 Sunday morning. In addition to these we go on and off the air whenever we feel like it as the facilities of the station are at our constant disposal.

"Incidentally, since receiving your card of about five weeks ago, we have been identifying ourselves every 15 minutes for the benefit of DX'ers; before then we had no idea that our measly 100 watts would reach far enough from Kingston to require identification as the people around here know us very well. Since you informed us we have been more considerate. We have heard from as far away as Tennessee and Iowa not to mention all over New York, Penna., New Jersey and Ontario.

"Due to the pressure of final exams however, our all night broadcasts terminated last Saturday night so you won't have to worry about us any more this year. Thanking you very much for interest shown and useful advice, we remain, Yours very truly" (signed)

WWBN - BETHANY, WEST VIRGINIA (600)

March 8, 1949

Mr. S. A. Rosenbaum - Dear Mr. Rosenbaum:

"The Bethany College Radio Society operates a campus carrier-current broadcasting station, WWBN, on 600 kc/ 8:00-11:00 nightly except Sunday. It can be received by broadcast receivers located near the power lines of Bethany. If you ever hear us on 600 or 1200 kc/ in Wheeling, please let me know, for we should not radiate much beyond 262 feet from our power lines, which distribute the programs to the dormitories and local receivers. Although we are registered with the Federal Communications Commission, we are limited in our radiation; and use only ten watts power.

"There are two other radio stations in Bethany, both amateur stations - W8PME and W8UNS. You can hear me any morning (9:00 to 10:00) on 3924 kc/s. from W8UNS, here at my home, talking to Pop, W8TCP in Warwood.

"Hope I have answered all your questions. About the only way you could hear and report WWBN would be to drive through Bethany some evening and tune in WWBN on your car radio. I think that would be a real scoop to report to N.R.C. Why don't you do it some evening and ask where Doc Allen lives. Be glad to show you the station. Yours," (signed) JSVAllen.

Sid adds that Bethany is 12 miles from Wheeling, and that he has heard WWBN several times in Wheeling.

WWOD - LYNCHBURG, VIRGINIA (1390)

Mr. Leo Herz - Dear Mr. Herz:

"Since our program of February 28 last, I have been rather busy and last week I attended the IRE convention in New York City. However, I intend to answer all the reports that I received.

TT 3:31-4:00. 3/18 - KCON on 1470 Kc/s. 3:10-3:35. Didn't get so much QRM from the Mexican but had a bad noise level to cut through. Daytime or back-yard DX - WLIO on 1570 Kc/s. 12:38-12:59 p.m., a good Q-4 R-9 and WBUT on 1580 1:00-1:15 p.m., also Q-4 R-9. WBUT signs off at 6:30 p.m. but at 6:00 p.m. meets QRM from CBJ. 3/20 - WDOV on 1410 on test instead of 3/18, 4:30-5:00. WING heard at 4:30 by accident saying Cooper asked them to announce the program 5:00-5:30 on 3/20. WING s/off at 5:00 on the nose. They were a good Q-4 R-9, same as WING. WGNR on 930 heard 5:39-5:56, and began to get a mess of that infernal noise lever; seemed good to hear some of the oldies of music for a change.
