Heat and outside activities curtailed listening here. On July 16 I heard WDXI on ET. They announced that no reports would be verified. Wanted to hear from DXers, however. They will get no report from me. On July 17, WCAE testing, V, WGRM on regular f/c. On July 18, WIBR WWNR WASK & WLOG all of f/c, KWPM on ET. On July 23, WRDW, regular, KCLG, regular. XERF announced they were switching to new power plant on August 1. Previous to August 1 they had two units. One was 75 kw and the other 150 kw. They will get a power increase of 20 kw each unit. On August 1, WHCC, WSIP and KUCB all on f/c. The call letters for the new Wheeling station will be WHLL on 1600 kc/s. Transmitter building is now under construction. Tests will start on completion this fall. James D. Sinyard, formerly of WHBO will start construction of a new station in Moundsville, West Virginia. Station will operate on 1370 kc/s., 250 watts output. No call letters assigned. Operation will begin in December. As both WHLL and the Moundsville station are in the Wheeling area, I will probably be able to provide advance information on tests. July 11 - WBGR on ET most of the morning. July 12 - KPLC testing through Mexican, 2:30 a.m. Veries from WPTR WJAY & WKAM. July 18 - WDXI on test of 5 kw. transmitter. Veries from WMEV WVMC & WDAY. WVMC by Raymond E. Luth, the Chief Engineer. August 1 - Veries from WTVB. Really hot - the last few days. 104° on July 30, 100 on the 29th, 101 the 28th, 99 the 27th, and no rain previous to the hot spell really dried things up. A couple of follow-ups to KFRD and WBEW. Too much static now for good DX. (Hope you can somehow find a way of making the Convention, Stan - Ed.)

Just a few lines about my DX activities of the present. Reports mailed out since the first of June went to the following ECB stations: CKRC WAGE KTRN WTTS & WRFD (both on daytime reception) WNAM (my second report in two years but still no reply - guess they don't care about being heard here) WIOU WBAY & WLEC & WLRP. All of these were heard in daylight hours, so I haven't done much night-time DXing lately. Too hot for comfort here most of the time despite an occasional breeze from the pond. WAGE came through with a neat green and white QSL card and a nice letter. CMKJ finally verified my report of last December in Spanish and written in longhand. WRFD and KTRN verified by letter. CKBL confirmed by a blue and white card. PRES on 980 kc/s. of Rio de Janeiro Brazil, finally verified my report of January 1946 after I sent them a re-report in Spanish and English with a stamped, self-addressed envelope. This is RADIO NACIONAL and they are a non-verifier on SW for me. This station gives me 9 countries and 4 continents verified on ECB. Not bad for a neasily 6-tube Sky Buddy, methinks. WFER verified my 1947 report by letter as did WFUR. WTTS sent a blue mimeographed card and WIOU sent a nice white card on a blue background similar to an invitation. Some of my more recent daytime catches were on Sunday mornings, thanks to the advice of Len Kruse who gave me the tips. Here's hoping that each and every NRC member had an enjoyable vacation time and that they will all resume DXing with their usual vim, vigor, and vitality. (Coming to Buffalo, Georgia? The Iowa boys are! -Ed)

Lefty Cooper - 438 East 21 Street - Brooklyn 26, N.Y.

The hottest summer in memory surely has taken some of the old pep out of me, but I still get in a little DXing on Sunday mornings. Recently returned from my vacation in the Adirondacks where I heard on the grave-yard channels, on top days, WGLN - WSNY - WENT - WABY - WWSW - WCSS, I tuned in on Sunday, August 7, and to my joy, landed three new ones to me - WISC, who signs off immediately after WHOM at 1:00 a.m.; the new WNAW on his believed first ET on 860 - the new North Adams outfit, and WHIN, Gallatin, Tenn., testing on 1010 after WINS blew at 3:00. I felt I'd never get WHIN due to their f/c coming during WINS' 24-hour schedule, but luck was with me. Veries now up to 1771, with the addition of a long-awaited card from WKMA signed by Robert A. Hadlox, staff engineer, who says the station was off the air from May 15 to July 25, and he says his f/c is at 2:30 a.m. with marches, but doesn't give the day, but I believe it is the second Monday. Letters from WTVB, WTWN, KGYN, WPIT, KJAY, WNER, CKEN & KNUJ also in, and CKBL's neat card also. There may be good news on 1450 soon - WWDC is attempting to purchase WOL and shift to 1260 and delete the WOL calls, and sell their 1450 plant to new owners. WWDC is a big money maker while WOL is not. This may mean that WWDC's all-night show will shift to 1260 and free 1450, for WNOE is going soon to 1060 kc/s you know. According to the latest FCC log, WWSW has until February to vacate 9490 in favor of 970, alas. Other loggings here have been WBGR on June 30 & July 4, WTWN on July 6, WTVB on July 10 and 17, and KGYN on July 17. Not much, but I've still got my finger in the pie. 1340 is getting fairly good now, for on Sunday, WEXL signed off at 2:00, as did WHAT, and WEMP retired at 3:00, leaving only weak WHHM & WBGE here. NNRC says that KICK, new Springfield, Mo. station is on all morning on Sundays on 1340. On July 4, on 1450, at 2:47 till way past 3:00, as station was testing with records and announcements, beginning, "Due to technical difficulties. ---" and then the engineer would cut him off until the music resumed.
