I have them verified from the Olewn location in 1954. 8/18-950, WGTA ET and asking for reception reports, very good here over all QRN. 990, KPMO ET tough, under 24-four KTHM. $8 / 20$ - and many momings, WBIP ETing on 1400. 8/19-1400, WIEL ETing. $8 / 25-1540$, WBNL ETing several mornings. $8 / 27-1480$, KLMS $3: 00 \mathrm{~s} / \mathrm{off}$. Tri hard and often before they broke through here. Also on the 27 ihh, KJAN, 1220, ET. $8 / 2 \varepsilon$ WLBL, 930 , ETing with tone and music. $8 / 31$ - Another toughie, WAAB s/on through carrier of THIS at 4:57. I have WAAB Boston verified from nack in 1936. 9/1-930, WREB ETing with a good sigmal, and at 7:00 p.m., WPMW heard signing off right after WIIL. 9/2-1340 came through with KBTA with $7 T$ 3:00-3:10 under WHHM \& EMMP. 1550, CBE with good strong signal all evening. On the morning of $9 / 3$ the Cubans were plentiful. Ernest R. Cooper, Dear Sir:
"This is in reply to your letter of September 5, 1950, with regard to a schedule of times at which standari broadcast stations conduct "Proof of Performance" tests, a list of the average monthly local sunrise and sunset times published by the Conmissior and a current list of Cuban stations operating in tne standard broadcast band.
"It is assumed that the "Proof of Perfomance" tests referred to are those required: by Section 3.46 (e) of the Rules. In this regard, however, you will note thit the Rule provides only that required measurements be maie at yeariy intervals and during the four month period preceding the date 66 filing application for renewal of license. No specific schedule is provided.
"Revision of Section 26 of the Standards of Gool Enginesring Practice Concerning Standard Broadcast Stations (Table of Average Time of Sunrise and Sunset based on local standard time in specified cities and localities in the United States) is presently under consideration. When adopted, a copy of the revised table will be forwarded for your convenience.
"A eurrent list of existing Cuban broadcast operations on the standard broadcast band is enclosed. . - Very truly yours," (signed) Wm. P. Massing, Acting Secretary.
