In some cases, they are only slogans adopted to fit the call; in others; the owner's name, and in quite a few cases the calls refleet a licensee long since gone, but the origin proves interesting to trace. In all instances, however, the source of information is either the station or the Federal Communications commission.

The stencils, pages $1,8,9,10$ were mailed at $8: 00$ a.m. Thursday. Saturday a card came to 438 saying the latter was found at G.P.O. N.Y.C. With no postage. I had put a California Centennial $3 \phi$ stamp on it, too. So I had to remit $6 \phi$ to G.P.O. N.Y.C. to have the letter move on. They couldn't get it till monday, so that meant a delay of 4 days. From now on, the stencils will go out with no return adjress on the envelope, you can bet on that. Here is a letter sent to the N.Y.C. Postmaster by Ye EA. Dear Mr. Goldman, 11/11/50 "This morning, I recieved in my mail box your card (Form 3540-A) telling me that a letter besting my return card was extracted from the mails at G.P.O. with no postage there-to affixed. It requested I send. $6 \phi$ in postage in order to have the letter sent on its way. It was intented for ... (Wagner's adiress).
"This letter contained four (4) typed stenoils which were in a most decided hurry to get to Mr. Wagner. Your holaing this letter back for no less than four (4) days has inconvanienced Mf . Wagner and me, and has anoyed 150 members of our club. I type these stencils here in Brooklyn and mail them to our Bxecutive Secretary, Mr. Fagner, at the above address. He is supposed to get them on Friday, and to mail out the printed pages on Saturday morning. Now this letier with the stencils was withdrawn from the mails on Thursday, Nov. 9 at G.P.O. I did not receive the notice card until Nov. 11. That means it will be until Monday, Nov. 13 before your office (fioom 4508) gets this postage, holding this important lettor up for four (4) days. "Now I work in a Post Office stition - Federal Reserve Station, New York 45. I know for a fact that we receive a considerable amount of mail there, and almost every day

 still sent through in an efficient manner with the postage plus fine being payed by the adiressee. Why then was this not done in this case? After all, with the specification of what train I wanted it to go out on, your men should have been able to figure dt was important and in a hurry. I don't see why such tactics were used in my case. I realize that the Post Office these days is nothing like it used to be when we got good serviee, and this stapid rula on holding up an inportant letter is one which should be stricken from the books. Every letter is imporrant and is in a hurryand it it up to you and the men under you to see that every one is delivered with dispatchf and celerity, and not held up like mine was.
"It would seem to me that since it had already been postmarked Church Street P.C. your men could mave seen that there had been a stamp on it, and it had cayje off! I fail to see why I shoula have to pay the original $3 \phi$, plus $6 \phi$ you request, plus $3 \phi$ for this let申er, or a total of l2ф to have one letter delivered! Suppose the stamp you put on comes off somewhere! I'd have to send more stimps, I suppose. That's quite a way to try to balance the budget, i'd say. But I guess we'll just have to get used to the poor service we now get. As usual, the public suffers from the bungling of Federal omployzes. Had I not have had my return adaress on that letter, you would have had to have sent it to North Girrard, Pa! Is this the price I have to pay because I follow the rules and include my return address? You may be assured from now on that on these letters to Kr. Wagner in North Girard that I WILI NOT PUT MY RETUPN ADDRESS ON THE ENVEINPE, simply because of the chance that the stamp might come off and the letter again be delayed! It would seem to me to be the fault of the Post Office whoe mail tube caused the stamp to come off. I know that the glue on the back of sone of the commemorative issues is very poor. For one, the Boy Scout stamp was very difficult to get to adhere to the envelope. I often had to use other glue to sticic it on. Why? ${ }^{\text {Wh }}$ Because of the Federal order cutting jown the mail service, it has suffered much. I donit see why you then go out of your way to maike it even poorer by this horrible example of hungling and dolay. Ineffioioncy like this is truly amazing! ...... "May I surgest a way to cut down expenses? Get rid of the ciucks who handle mail in this careless, hap-hazzard fashion and get men who cars something for their job and the public, whom they are supposed to serve.
"A copy of tinis letter is being sent to the Fostmaster General, Washington, D.C. I hope_to hear from botnoffices_in this matter.
