But to get to DX news. Ny receiver is a 1049 11-tube Hallim crafters $S X-43$, AM \& FM. Ny aerial is about 70 long, running $N-S$ on top of the apartment house, with a 201 drop lead-in. Our water pipe serves as the ground. My DX den is rather mall \& cozy, of by itself above the landord's front hall, so my DXing bothers no one. Besides the SX-43 on its table, we have our bit desk, swivel chair \& an easy chair, \& usually a card talbe set up for extra papers, logs, sowing, etc." Insterd of veries, the walls are covered with maps, of S.F.
