

Inventory shut-down. 12/31 - WALB (1590) TT/f/c 2:00-2:15 as per f/c list. No music used. 1/1 - WWCO (1240) finally sent a report to this semi-local. WRAW (1340) TT-f/c 5:00-5:15 as per list. WKOP (1360) s/on regular sked 5:30 (ex-750 kc/s.) WWBZ (1360) s/on regular 6:00 over WKOP-WSAI. 1/2 - WORA (1150) TT-f/c 1:00-1:15 through WCOP music test. WGBS (710) 2:53 to 3:00 s/off (WOR silent.) 1/3 - Send third report to WHOK (1320) TT-f/c 2:00-2:15, also 2nd report to WINZ (940) show from Art Mooney's Club 2:30-3:00 s/off and at 4:15, a real surprise, KIT (1280) booming in here like a local with a DX-f/c and a big plug for the NRC and members in New Zealand. Best reception yet from PST zone. I shall be watching "DX News" to see how many NRCers in the east heard them. If you heard them. please send them a thank-you note if you have them verified or a good report of you need them. In either case, be sure to express thanks for the NRD plug. KSIJ (1430) recorded music f/c 4:45-5:00 as per list. 1/5 - KCOL (1410) NNRC DX 3:45-4:15 in with a fine signal WHUC (1230) TT-f/c over WITH-WNOR QRM, 5:45-6:00. 1/6 - No sign of KWOR (1490) or KRDO (1240) on DX. Both needed, too. WJBK spoiled all hope of KWOR while WEDC took care of KRDO until 4:00, then WHAI musical check on the last 15 minutes. WJMO. (1540) "T-f/c 5:30-5:45 as per list. WLBR (1270) TT-f/c 5:50-5:59 and s/on regular sked at 6:00. Reports now 831 for 2 years and 3 days of DXing. Veries did not slow up here all week until Friday when 3 came in to make my verified total 598. WKOP (1360) new QSL card is red blue and black on white background. Diffferent from QSL card used last year on 750 kc/s, and letter from WWBZ (1360) and WALA (1410) I found I had neglected to order more NRC forms so sent the last 6 reports out on plain stationery, and I sent an order to Wagner for 200 more forms. To me they have been par excellence" bringing in a much better percentage of veries than I got before using them. I send NRC forms and NNRC seals on the envelopes and I like the results I see, That Mexican XETK did not show here as re-scheduled. KCBC did not s/off at 3:00. They were on after 3:15 in the clear. Tuned to 1390 again after 3:30 and found KCBC off. Probably s/off at 3:30, but no sign of XETK. Waited until after 4:00 but no luck. Must sign and get this in the mail. Snow and sleet here, Sunday, 2:00 PM.

Last night I fooled around with aerials and got the right combination. Vigra was S-9 on top of 630. My low band from 1240 down is out of alignment and pretty weak, but Stavanger was S-7. Seemed to be Italy on 1034 with S-5. Static kept building up all morning. Only good BBC was the one on 1214 with re-broadcast of Australian cricket game. Was S-7 at 3:00 s/off and was still S-4 at 4:00 s/on. Listened for 40 minutes to one on 1223 but no announcement of any kind. One on 657 heard from 2 till fade-out & another after 4 s/on, seemed to be Italian again. Lots others heard, too numerous to mention. One on 657 still coming in at 4:45.
