A separate contest for DX Specials OMIV was decided upon by the Board. It would follow the same pattern al the contest of the past two years. Carrodl Seth volunteered to senve us Manager for this DX Specials Contest. Dotails yill appear in a forth-coming issue of the club bulletin.

When submitting the entry fee all contestants must agaver the foll wing questions:
A. Would I prefer one good prize or soveral sinall ones?
B. Would I be willing to pay an assessinent to provide the winner with (I) an electric clock or (2) a world Globe?
C. Which of tho above prizes do I prefer?
3. Contest will run for the period october 1, 1951 until march 31, 1952. Loggings must be from one spocific location excopt with the permission of the manager. Entries may be sumbittod until June 30, 1952 。
4. All foreign stations are oligible and will be counted as follows: one point will be given for each foreign station verified. This total will then be multiplied by the number of countrics verified to give the total point score. (Example 12 veries from 3 countries--36 points) An exception is madu for canada. A contestant may submit one verio for each canadian province or territory, but may use canada as a multiplier only onco. In all countries except canada any number of veries may be submitted for points. In canada, only one for each province or as mentioned, torritory.
5. The decision on prizes will bo announeod whon all votos aro in. 6. Contest standings will be published from time to time deponding on availablo spaco.
