DX NEWS FOREIGN DX DIGEST

Edited by Fred VanVoorhees, Box 132, Lemoyne, Penna., Deadline Wed AM Last week's format seemd to receive general approval, so we will continue to present the column in this way.

NORTH AMERICA -

ALASKA-Most everyone writing states that they were not able to hear the DX dedication from KFAR and no one reported hearing it. The NNRC has reported KENI (550), Anchorage, s/off 5 AM by a California listener. Also KIFW (1230) Sitka with FC 0540 on 10/22 by a Washinton listener. AFB (1400) Nome, was reported at 0330 on 11/11 by a listener in Galifornia.

MEXICO-BF and HSW report XEWA (540) in San Luis Potosi, SLP, as good. HSW has old report out since March sent to SLP address. HSW also complains on his failure to secure veries from XEAW-XEX. Any help here on signers. On 12/3 from 3:45-4 AM on 1340 FW heard a Mexican station, sounding like XE-W, may have been XELW in Guadalajara. Did anyelse hear him? XEN is still on 695 according to SM.

GUATEMALA-Both SM and HW report evening reception of TGUX (1025) Guatemala City. Incidentally YSC in San Salvador is more powerful and on the same frequency. May be hard to identify correct one.

EL SALVADOR-Many regulars continue to report YSEB on 1075, but no verie reported as yet. SM reports on a new one heard after WTAM went off 12/3 at 1 AM. It was YSABC, "Radio Emisora Salvadorena", with a special initial test program offering prizes to local listeners, playing dance music, etc., and announcing that first regular broadcast would begin at 10 AM local time. All in Spanish and went off at 1:28 AM.

COSTA RICA-This country offers one of the most fertile fields for evening listening with all of the following on split frequencies reported by SM as regulars: TIGPH (605), TIPG (625), TIHB (684), TIRA (735), TIW (763), TICS (855), TIFC (995). Lots of good hunting here. EAM BAHAMAS-FW reports ZNS (1540) received from 9-10 PM through KXEL, and signing off at 10 PM. Received S-8 in Erie.

BERMUDA-SM is now tentatively hoping to set up the special over the new Bermuda station for Monday, February 4, 4:30-5 AM, but many changes may occur before that time.

PUERTO RICO-Many have reported the NNRC sp5cial following the regular 3rd Wednesday check from WXRF (1590). FW reminds us that this check is regular and well heard in Erie. WPAB (Ponce, (550) seems to be definitely checking every Monday morning from 3:30-3:45, checked last three Monday mornings by FV and others. SM corrects us on the power of WKVM. He has 25 KW, not 10 KW as reported last week. HSW complains of no veries from WIPR-WRIA-WCMN-WTIL-WORA-WIBS-WKVM. Any recent verie signers here?

JAMAICA-Following up Evan Roberts' report last week, Radio Jamaica was logged with the cricket matches by EC and SM on 12/2 and 12/3 just a hair below 870, just as Evan told us. Signed off with "God Save the King" at 2:35 AM. FV tried on 11/30 but did not hear him.

TRINIDAD-FV had more luck with "Radio Trinidad", also heard by CS, EC, and SM with the cricket matches. Loggod here on 11/30 from 12:56 with piano music. CUBA-News a little light on Cubans this week. BF reports Cubans on 600 and 550, undoubtedly CMKV and CMW. CMKV signing on at 6 AM Sunday with Cadena Azul programs. EC reports Cadena Azul stations still on at 2:45 AM 12/4. Heard on 570-590-600-840-960. Also heard was CMCH on 790 Kcs.

NOTE to BF: We will publish a copy of the Spanish form letter just as soon as I can find my copy. Perhaps some have ideas as to improvement

ARGENTINA-HW also heard the station reported by BS last week, but he hasn't identified it either. Thinks is must be a South American. HW had it 4-4:40 AM.

COLOMBIA-HJCZ (710) Bogota, was heard on 12/2 and reported by CS thanks to the tip in this column. Thanks, CS. For all who need him, SM reports that HJKM (738) Bogota, is in evening regular.

VENEZUELA-RG reports YVML (1180) "Radio Cabinas" signing on at 5:30 AM Sunday morning with good signal in clear for at least the 1st half-hour. SM also reports YVKL (1095) as one of his regulars in the evening.

PERU-Also among the split frequency stations heard by SM during the evening is OAX4A (854) Lima. We can't see how he separates this one from TICS on 855.

OCEANIA

AUSTRALIA & NEW ZEAL D-BS reports that reception is now falling off from these countries. Lis only new catch is 4ZB (1040) at 5 AM on 11/28. HW thinks he had stations on 660 and 880, but not strong enough to log.

WESTERN SAMOA-A California listener of the NNRC has received 2AP (1420) Apia, from 3:30-4 AM sign-off on 10/30, perhaps a good one?

HAWAII-BF asks if Hawaiians over get to Mass. I would say "Yes" judging by the powerful signal KULA (690) puts in here. Try him around his 4 AM sign-off. HW adds that he often has foreign language programs and is sure this is the station CS reported previously on 690.

EUROPE

Here again BF asks for advice on tuning TA stations. Best time to tune for them is from Midnight to 1:30 AM. Sometimes they hold up later, but peak around 1-1:30. Strong carriers heard here from 1586 Germans, BBC on 1295, and Monte Carlo (1466) but no modulation. Almost all operate on split frequencies. WORLD RADIO HANDBOOK gives them. CS thinks maybe he had some carriers on 944 (Toulouse) and 1088 (Droitwich) as well as others, but not sure.

GERMANY-SM reports Voice of America (1195) Munich, heard during the evening hours.

ITALY-SM reports reception recently (Peak on 12/4) from the sychronized stations on 656 Kcs., as well as from Rome (845). Good news to know the lower freq. stations are coming in well too.

SWITZERLAND-SM reports reception from Sottens (764) through nearby WJZ.

HOLLAND-SM reports Hilversum on 746 coming in quite well. BELGIUM-Brussels on 926 also reported by SM, but quite weak. FRANCE-SM's report includes Nency (836) and Paris (863). NORWAY-Staveneer (1313) is this country's representative this week

ENGLAND-SM roperts BBC stations on 881 and 908.
