Jen. 31, Coral Gables to Mempa, driving through the Everglades at high noon produced Latins on 21 diffenent frequencies between 1100 and $1600 \mathrm{kc} / \mathrm{s}$. The portable does not have good selectivity, so I don't krow exactly what frequencies they were on. WORZ apparently bearis SW as they are easy to hear ohly in that direction.
