Musings of the Hembers Gene Francis - 402 Sterry Street - Playa del Rey, Calif. Sun., Feb. 3, Yazoo City to Clarksdale, return to New Orleans. KCRV exceelent at 7:50 s/cn, WECZ a surprise catch through heavy QRM, WRAG weak but cleat at high moon in Clarksdale. Had I known WCLD was going to DX for us only hours later, I would have stopped in to see them while in Cleveland. Mon. Feb. 4, New Orleans to Natchitoches. WERH not on for test, KDSH with DX program, slightly stronger than WWJ. You'd never believe how Matchitoches was pronounced by looking at the spelling. But everybody, including the KWCJ announcers, call it Nackadish! Looks like KDSH should be there, instead of Boise. Tues., Feb. 5. Natchitoches to Shreveport - KOSY puts in a very poor signal at all times, surprisingly. KTRY equally as good. Friends I was staying with live block and a half from KTBS! sttractive suburban studios. Wed. Feb. 6, Shreveport to Duncan, Okla. WCBC on that special strike program till all hours of the morning, WJAM good at 7:00 s/cn (all times are EST, naturally) and then began the logging of a slew of 250 watt day time stations in Texas, which pack an amazing wallop all over the dial, even though I was 50 and more miles from their transmitters. Only really tough one was KCLW, which was baily QH led by KALT most of the time, and later by KRRV, as I made my final northern swing, entering a new state for me, Oklahoma. Got to Duncan in time to be dragged to a basketball game between Fort Sill and the local Halliburton semi-pro team. Would rather have DKed. Feb. 7, Duncan to Seymour, via Altus - Cleaned up Western Oklahdma before leaving Duncan at 1 p.m. The rare little KVLH is heard well all day. Could harily believe that little KELT could pack such a mean wallop.
