BOARD NEWS

By recent action, the Board has unanimously voted the following addition to Article 9 "Duties of Officers", sub-division 'Editor' of the by-laws of the NRC:

ADD THE FOLLOWING:

"or portion of any report, at the Editor's discretion, exceeding thirty (30) printed lines in 'DX News'."

THIS ADDITION TO THE BY-LAWS IS EFFECTIVE AS OF MARCH 25, 1952.

*From Board Chairman LEN KRUSE, Dubuque, Ia.

This means that if reports run over the 30-line amount in "DX News" your Editor may cut it at the very next point. If this is done, it will NOT be held over to the next issue. The report will be considered finished as printed. Now this is being done for these reasons. First and most important, we would have such bulky issues of "DX News" if we didn't set such a limit, that we would have to raise our dues to cover the cost of additional paper, ink, stencils and postage. Secondly, your Editor devotes about 10 hours an issue (or more) to typing these stencils, and feels he should not have to pick out parts of reports to get only the "meat" of it in, or run any special service in breaking up reports for use in more than one issue. It all adds up to more time spent here in preparing these "DX Newses." Therefore, the above was proposed by your Editor to the Board through the Chairman, Len Kruse, and it was passed unanimously. Now this is NOT a blanket rule - note the words "at the Editor's discretion." If a report runs a bit over and is chock full of good DX news, it will not be cut unless there just isn't any more room. Reports of regular offenders and those reports which do not come to the point will be subjected to this addition to the above-stated rule.

Then on 3/25 a Spanish speaker on 890 Kcs. under WENR at 0002. Sounded like they said Colombia, but not sure. (Probably HJCI (888) in Bogeta, La Voz de la Victor".)
