Now that the current $\bar{D} \bar{X}$ season has come to a close, it is once again time to go back over and look at the results of the good efforts of the CPC. A total of 80 special programs were arranged and went on the air as scheduled with the exception of a couple who wore a day late. You will nate that over $2 / 3$ of the 48 states were represented with epocial programs. Texas, the state with the greatest number of otations, had the greatest number of specials, namely, 7. Several stations promised to conduct special DXes but failed to go on and, of course as usual, some refused and others ignored the CPC requests altogether. In addition to the domestic stations, there were 15 foreigns including Canadians, which dedicated special programs to the NRC. It can be reedily seen that the 1951-1952 DX Season was outstanding for the fine specials arranged by the CPC. A special tribute should be paid to Sid Roseribaum for his fine cooperation and endeavors in his CPC work and compliments shculd go out to each and every member of the CPC for his fine work this year.
