THE 1951-1952 DX SEASON IN RETROSPECT

Now that the current DX season has come to a close, it is once again time to go back over and look at the results of the good efforts of the CPC. A total of 80 special programs were arranged and went on the air as scheduled with the exception of a couple who were a day late. You will note that over 2/3 of the 48 states were represented with special programs. Texas, the state with the greatest number of stations, had the greatest number of specials, namely, 7. Several stations promised to conduct special DXes but failed to go on and, of course as usual, some refused and others ignored the CPC requests altogether. In addition to the domestic stations, there were 15 foreigners including Canadians, which dedicated special programs to the NRC. It can be readily seen that the 1951-1952 DX Season was outstanding for the fine specials arranged by the CPC. A special tribute should be paid to Sid Rosenbaum for his fine cooperation and endeavors in his CPC work and compliments should go out to each and every member of the CPC for his fine work this year.

The ground system has a general slope of 20° approximately. It is on the brow of a hill so it has a curvature as well so it inclines from a northern to an eastern direction. It was some job pitting the ground system in. It had to be cable plowed." The letter was signed by Edwin L. Meek, Engineer, 1360 kc/s.
