W F A S - 1230 - White Plains, New York - 11/26, 4-4:45 EST

Here is a station which is 24 years old, but none the less is still missing from many DX Logs. This program will be designed especially to penetrate the two all night stations expected to run interference for WFAS, namely WNOR and WEAR. There will be tone at the outset, with call letters interspersed throughout its duration, and then WFAS will switch to music, identifying every one, and also identifying the station after each. Mr. Frank A. Seitz, Managing Director of WFAS is hoping for a lot of DX mail, and so are we, and let's all make certain to tune for this station, located in Westchester County, just north of New York City. C F R C - 1490 - Kingston, Ontario - 11/26, 4-5 EST

Here is a DX program from an old station which has always been a fine friend to us DXers, and once again they are going to honor us with a special program. In spite of their 100 watts, they have gotten out most surprisingly on their past DXes and it is to be hoped they have lost none of their old zing. Of course, 1490 is a rather troubled spot on your dial, what with at least three all-nighters on - WTXL, KTOP and CKOX, but let's try for them, and we feel they'll come in for lots of us. Anthony Lagatutta Jr. - 371 Eighth Avenue - New York, New York

DX is very good here now! Have logged 17 new stations since last DX report: WBRK (1340); WARE (1250); WDEL (1150); WCKR (610); CMQH (640); WDVA (1250); WERI (1230); WOAI (1200); WNLK (1350); WSWA (550); WDEF (1370); CMCF (910); CMCH (790); WLBR (1270); XELO (800); WPDQ (600); XEB (1220). This brings the log up to 198 logged and 85 verified. Only two late veries, WTEL (860) and CKOY (1310). Those 100 report forms arrived today. The number of veries received here should jump way up now that I got the report forms. I got out 14 reports today. Sent an airmail letter to ZNS. Sure hope they verify. WTEL was very clear the afternoon I logged it, yet they are only 250 watters. New 250 watters logged since last report are: WBRK (1340), WERI (1230). I finally got WDEL in Wilmington. I got my first Florida stations and three of them. WPDQ in Jacksonville override semi-local WIEK, WCKR (ex-WIOD) in Miami overrode semi-local WIP or was WIP off the air? Isn't WIP AN? (Yes-Ed.) WMBR in Jacksonville overrode WOKO for a while. Times I heard these were: WPDQ 9:15, WCKR 10:15, WMBR 9:05, p.m. XELO-800 had on an English program at 9:15. At 9:25 XELO had completely knocked out CKLW-800, but most of the time XELO was under CKLW. Lefty, I believe WAVY's QTH is Norfolk, Va. or thereabouts. I don't think they lost it, hi! Lefty, what are the conditions that effect BCB DX reception? How do these things affect DX? A friend of mine said he heard a station around 590-610, call letters are WX104. He thought it might be a telephone exchange and wrote the Telephone Company. No such station in their records! He believed they said CBS Network, so he wrote to CBS. They said they had no knowledge of any WX104. Upon writing to the FCC he got the same answer - "No WX104." I forgot to ask him when he heard "WX104" but I listen now a lot to that part of the dial hoping to hear WX104. Did anyone hear of a WX104? I have only one beacon logged, NSC on 532 kc/s. in Floyd Bennett Air Field in Brooklyn, N.Y. Not far from here, but only 50 watters! Most home radios can pick up NSC. XEB-1220 override WGAR for a while but soon faded. The leading state in my log is Pennsylvania with 32 logged; 29 from New York is second, but if I had logged the 16 N.Y.C. locals which I don't do, New York would be the leader.
