With seven DX Specials scheduled for 11/26 I am sorry to report only two of them were heard at this Gen. The 10,000 watt KDAY (1580) Santa Monica, Ca. came in very well even though the first portion had some QRM from 1 kw. WPGC, Morningside, Md. who was testing. The KLFT-dx (1600) Golden Meadow, La. even though not new here came in very strong although one hour later than scheduled in the "DX Calendar." I doubt if the KEVL DX was on as planned as there was no sign of them beneath AN WAKR and the WPKH DX failed to show as the 950 spot was completely clear that hour. The DXes also slated on 11/26 did not show, these were WFAS CFRC CFDA. The two fine DX Specials on 11/27 were heard well. Stations WBNB (1420) Harrodsburg, Ky. and WAMO (860) Homestead, Pa. were both new in my DX Log. Only one letter verification was received this past week and that came from WHPB, Centerville, Tennessee.

A few words about my doings at this place might be in order. I always read with interest what the other guys are doing although you seldom hear from me. At my age (going on 77 you know) it does not seem worth while getting up to date equipment. My old S-20-R has to serve the purpose, and sometimes is doing fairly well. Since the first Special for this season I have reported only 24 new to me stations. Only nine of these were DX Specials. A few did not show here and several were not needed. Right here, a hearty thanks goes out to our excellent CPC. What would we do without them? A special thank you to Bill Stone for the wonderful Canadian Parade. Verifications are slow coming in and the Specials are slower than the rest of the stations reported. How come? This Morning December 3 CJOC 1220 not ID but someone here; WEND 1380 did not show; CFMX 920 like a local almost. WPHB 1260 signed off a test at 3:01 asking for phone calls and reports. 1280 sure was a hot spot with WBI signing off as late as 3:36, and that still left two more stations taking turns of being on top so that both could be copied. The 1360 Kc. station, formerly HI2S, La Romana, now becomes HI8T in La Vega, retaining power of 100(1), and this is now in operation. HI4F (1440) Salcedo is not deleted, and HI2A now operates on 1440 Kcs. in Salcedo with 40 watt, having moved from 1490 Kcs. and from a location in Pimental. (All from FCC)
