Can't build up much of a verie collection thusly. Veries have been received from 690 KEPO New Year's Eve program. It might be they signing off at 4; haven't listened Sunday AMs lately); 920 KDES, 990 WHOO, autographed snapshot of Miss Mickie Evans included; 1230 KJUR; 1440 WABR; 1510 CKOT for one DX ID and 1600 KLAJ, snapshot with verie on back. HONDURAS--QSL card, long friendly letter, and reply card from HROW (845) Tegucigalpa, signed by Alfredo Leon Gomez, Manager. Address Apartado 253. Power is now 1250 watts. Mr. Gomez' son is a doctor at a Washington Hospital, so he was most interested in my report and having me chat with his son. A very friendly station. (RA)

GUATEMALA--TGED (1210) Guatemala City. Air mail verie in good English states that TGED will use 20000 watts in two months or so and will be most powerful CA station. Typed signature is Marco Tulio Illescas, but apparently written and signed by Oscar P.----(Illegible) SW outlet is TGEF on 42 mtrs. (HT) QSL card from TGTO Guatemala City listing frequency as 819 Kcs., although heard on 820. Address 5 a Ave. Sur No. 9. Signer not readable. (RA)

MEXICO--XEMS (1490) Matamoros, rubber stamped International Reply Card, scrawled signature. Address looks like Aptdo 13. This is final result of reception for 12/3/55. (HT) Long Spanish verie-letter from KELG (680) Leon, Gto., soon to go to 10 Kw. Day, 5 Kw. Night, signed by Roberto Lopez, address Apartado 301. Presently 1000(5) DA-N. Logged on 1/28 0130-0200 sign-off with KNBC on under and with KENS testing. (PT)

COSTA RICA--I'm listing this here, although it might have some meaning to those hunting Surinam. HW left his set tuned to 920 on 2/4 and set his alarm. Did not hear AVROS, but did hear a Spanish speaker come on. Then on 2/11 it was positively identified as TIRS "Radio Athenea" who has been anywhere from 915 to 925 recently. Hal says he came on at 0435 on 921-922 Kcs. Sorry, no AVROS. (HW)

From Keith Robinson*-Reception is poor here, much the same as last year. I have reported VRH3, WSAN, Rozelkade (580), WJCD-DX, WERE, 2VM, KENT, KPAL, KSUE, KBYR, KRAK, KAPR, KPIN, KYOK, KEIM. Veries are letters from WNOB, KASB, WIMP, CJRC, KWIQ, CKSL (returned postage), EDAY (thanks, Hank), Kosice (1932), cards from VRH3, 5PA, KWKW, prepared cards from EDEM and WOCK.

GENERAL

Late issues from Newark News Radio Club, and from New Zealand Radio DX League are at hand and will be gone over before next week to see if anything worthwhile to be used. In the meantime I will try to have the Colombian list ready for either next week or the week after. Still no sign of the SUPREMACY RABINGS, so probably will not have them now until March. Here follows a guest editorial on verifying DX stations by Hank Tyndall:

In response to Hank Wilkinson and others, I will try to set forth my views and various experiences regarding foreign reception, particularly "south of the border". I am no oracle, nor do I have any lordomain to offer, and I do not wish to influence any member of this club with my own versions, DX is a hobby, to be pursued i own

way, for our own pleasure, but when we become affiliated with a club, we must then exercise care that we do nothing that might affect our friendly relations with radio station personnel. Firstly, I have never in over 32 years of verifying, written a station in any other language than English. Length of time for follow-ups depend on the country and also the location. I have written to Mexicans in two months and Aussies in 3 months.

In many cases, 1st follow-up includes postage and IRC or a dime, but then for the 3rd effort, I like the Air Letter (10¢ to any part of the world). Int. Reply cards are used next and I have over 60 foreign stations verified in this way. In followingup, I usually put something like this at the bottom: Estimado Senor: reporte estacion HZIP onda larga 1165 Kcs., 10:00-10:45 PM, EST, 7 enero (Jan 7) programa musica. (Slogan or any brief data, next) Gracias por su confirmacion carts (QSL). Gracias amigos. I know very little Spanish but if you know of any additions, put on anything you desire.

I do a great deal of letter writing, that is part of my success in getting thru to some of the tough ones. Evan Roberts and I both heard ZP9 some years ago, I tried all the usual things, and particularly wanted Paraguay, so I finally wrote Washington and got the name of the U. S. Ambassador. Sent a very nice letter asking if he could have someone contact the station. No answer came and I wrote Washington again and the lady I had contacted suggested that I write the Embassy, not the "boss man". She said that this would be opened up and perhaps passed around to the right party. It sure was, it was turned over to an attache who was a "ham", and he went to the station, claimed that my letters were all over the place, but they did not understand what I wanted. He got the engineer to type out a good verie in Spanish, checked it over and forwarded it to me, along with his own letter. And so ZP9, 970 Kcs. Asuncion, Paraguay, became my #1 all-time effort. My #2 verie has just been received. HJKA (675) Bogota, Colombia. A perfect verie and in perfect English. First report sent in October, 1952, IRC's, Air letters, reply cards, new reports, etc., all failed. In my insidious way I got a bit "pally" with one of the Cadena Nacional officials, finally beguiled him into giving me the name of the Engineer at HJKA with the promise that I would not publicize it. I figure I spent \$1.96 on this one station, but it is just another victory for the old blood-hound who never gives up the trail. Here is what I can offer, and still keep my word. The address for HJKA is Radiotelevisora Nacional de Colombia, Direccion Nacional de Informacion y Prensa, Bogota, Colombia. No Box or St. number, but would suggest attn Jefe del Departamento Tecnico. All this has taken up valuable space, but it is done to impress upon the neophytes that the old vets have to work just as hard to get their veries and there are no miracles, just sweat, time, and patience, and a lot of writing, if you really want that verie. I also believe in reporting the stations on the exact frequency heard even tho a great many of them state, "You state you heard us on 1197 Kcs., but we were exactly on 1200 Kcs." A great many Central Americans drift a bit, or are off to try to avoid interference, but mighty few will admit it. I have veries from 162 Mexicans, 127 South Americans, 63 Central Americans, and this represents quite a bit of experience with our Spanish friends. Wish I could profer an infallible recipe for them, but I can assure you that I have no secret weapon, just my typewriter, and a burning ambition to use it, but always with COURTESY.

Many thanks to Hank Tyndall for writing the above on his many experiences in verifying stations, particularly in South and Central America. Rather than start a new stencil, I'm going to send the list of reporters to Hal, hoping he can get them in someplace else. 73
