Bo BCB DXing since my report last month. During the past week or two I have been concentrating on delinquent stations. F/ups have been mailed to CMJZ 1580 for reception in 1955, and LR-4 which was received in April of '56. For the last season TISA 830, FJA-10 655, HJKR 1220, TIBSD 1195, XEWE and XEWQ on 760 and 1190 kc/s. respectively, CMGM 1440, XERPM 660, WSGN 610, WLOH 1490, and WZKY 1580 have also received f/ups. As I wish to write as few f/ups as possible, PP cards and stamps of the respective countries were enclosed. I find that LA stations are more apt to answer if one sends them an uncanceled stamp in lieu of an IRC. Also it is cheaper for the DXer. For instance I recently purchased a mixture of surface and air mail stamps for many LA countries at a local stamp dealer. The cost was \$5.30 plus receiving credit for stamps that I traded in, which had accumulated from the DX hobby over the past few years. Figured the same amount in IRCs would have come to around \$12.00. Recent veries have included a PP card from WZKY 1580 and a postal from WAMD 970 which states that their transmitter is most directional in order to protect WRC on 980 and WWSW on 970. Was rather surprised to received a PP card from WEVA 860. Original report mailed in April of '56 and f/up sent on July 22, '56. The following note will probably appear in Fred's section, but it won't hurt to repeat it here. I'll no doubt write a few Latins for DX programs this season. If you have any stations you would like to hear, let me know. The station must be on a frequency which is clear of NA QRM some time during the week. Please list stations' frequency and when you believe or know their channel to be open. Sorry I can't join you in Ponca City but have hopes that I'll see you fellows next year at Laconia, N.H. 73s.
