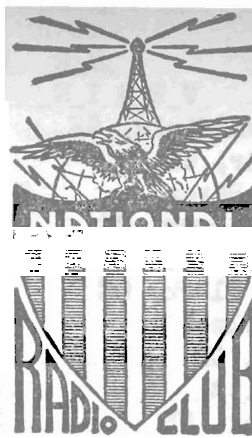

I hadn't figured they'd be on for at least a couple more months. They were about even with XERF, while a month ago, WBUZ-1570 in Fredonia, N.Y., three times further away and four times less powerful knocked XERF all over the place. WGAV said they were using one billion milliwatts. 9/9- Mystery station on 787 with classical music went unidentified. Heard around 1:44 a.m. On 1420, WCRE was testing and only slightly better than CMCG, adress unknown, hi. During the 1956-1957 DX season, the age-worn complaint of stations refusing to verify reports of reception was again the subject of much discussion. As a result of this, I asked permission of the Board of Directors of the National Radio Club to conduct a survey on the matter, hoping to ascertain which stations were the worst offenders in this regard, and to find out how many stations were actually refusing to verify all correct reports of reception. In the back of mind, of course, the thought was present as to what, if anything, could be done about the problem of stations not verifying correct reports of reception. It was thought at the time that the problem was really a distressing one and that a large percentage of stations had apparently taken the attitude that reports would not be verified. The results of this survey were indeed illuminating, and I feel that all members who were kind enough to send their data on delinquent stations voluntarily, plus those members who were kind enough to answer reply postcards that were sent out from here, should have a report on the results that the survey seemed to have indicated. Necessarily, the first concern was to find out from the members which stations were delinquent in verifying to them, and to tabulate from all the replies to this address the call of every station listed by someone as being delinquent. Many members sent this data voluntarily or in answer to my reply cards, with the result that information was received from sixty or more active DXers during the past season.

My frank analysis of the non-verifying situation is that it is not as bad as it seems to the individual. We all have stations we refuse to verify for us, while they seem to verify readily for others. Certainly with a membership such as our club enjoys, located throughout the country, it seems safe to assume that a large majority of the some 3000 stations are being reported and verified by someone. The above listing shows only a handful of stations that seem to be really troublesome to more than a few of us. Since the stations do NOT owe us anything in the way of a verification of a report, it would seem logical to assume, by and large, that we fare pretty well in the matter of verifications. Several of those stations listed above are now coming through with belated verifications-CJNB WICW WSAC WPKO WAMO are all reported in recent bulletins. The solution seems to be, as it always has been, that good concise adequate reports, with return postage, the courteous approach and the exercise of polite patience will bring results in all but a few instances. One poor report with a discourteous follow-up can do a great disservice to the rest of the membership. Report fully, send postage and
