WIAK on 1430 at s/on at 6:30, weekdays at 6:00 a.m., and daytime report to WMGV on 1490. CKCR and WETA battle in background. 1/5- WAUD on 1230 kc/s. 3:07-3:36 for a new one for a Q4RS signal. KANE on 1240 f/c 3:40-3:56. And HHGM on 1430, not 1473, Mexican on 1470 a powerhouse, so tried S.W. 6165, and they were on in good shape, so by accident caught 1430, 3:55-4:30 - bet Johanns got them. And an evening report to KLOU on 1580 kc/s. 9:03-9:50 p.m. 1/6- WSAC on 1460 for a new one, 2:51-3:00. KIXL on 1040 kc/s. for N.Z. DX. 1/2- KTRO on 1400 test 4:00-4:20. 1400 kc/s. getting me a lot of new dx ones. KEEF on 980 kc/s. 3:00-3:15, WSAV on 630 for Q5R9 signal 3:36-3:46. KPEX DX show 4:00-4:32 with KHON QRM not too bad. Another day report - WBYS on 1560, 5:50-6:00 p.m. the s/off. 1/11- KSDJ on 1170 kc/s. 2:46-3:00. WCNR DX show a dandy with familiar old dishes, 3:00 to 4:15; KXLK test on 1400, 4:17-4:37. KBIO TT on 1400, 4:19-4:25. And I hope this one's correct - HUGN on 1400 4:30-5:00a.m. - we will know later. WAVL a good daytime station here. Nights it's WJHL. 20 reports and 22 veries in one week! 6 on Saturday. DX Special veries from WRBC WALL WCHA WKOB WBAA. Others - WATN KPEK KXA KFAR (ah!) KTRC WHHL WXLT KTAN KGW CJOB KTRH KOGT WIAK WJL KNOX KIMA KLOU. KLOU letter verie a real verie to be prized that's a r-e-a-l one, by Harold J. Kolari, CE. Mine most distant report so far. KFAR letter verie in 8 days, air mail, by J. Jay Bickel, Acting CE. My report most complete from this part. This one a real prize. Alaskan time at Fairbanks is 5 hours difference from E.S.T. and 1/2 hour behind Hawaiian, according to veries, and program announcements. Reports on 60 new stations out, plus 1,122 veries so far will net me 1200 if they all come back with a few more to be heard.

Not much DXing done this week, only 2 reports went out: WJDX, 1300, RS, and WCNR-dx. Have now 57 reports out, with 586 veries - a gain of 80 since last season. Veries in week from my Iowa DXing - card: KXXX TGWC CKNW KAMQ KMVI KLPR WXAL WJL WTON WETX WVVW WSFC KHQ WIBS. From Chicago - Cards from KOGT and KLCN, letters from WRDW and KXLW. I see that my letters to WBAT and WHOO did result in the boys' getting definite veries, contacted KWAE - the CE told me they are getting cards printed and will verify all rpte.

This is to prove that I have been swirling (or twirling) the dials. The veries have been good also. WNAE WKRC WVIP WKLX WFPG WLW WIEP all have arrived. WRAB went on the air January 1, 1958 with a good signal of 500 watts. Have written, no verie. During the up and coming Regent's Week, I will change the shape and directivity of my antenna. Although I have been in the NRC for over one year, I haven't reported as yet, so here goes. I am 16 and in high school, which, along with my father, limits my DXing to next to nothing. I have reported the following this winter: WMUC WBCM WAOK WZYX-dx KPOK-dx WKLX-f/c, WLEK WKXV-f/c, WLCS WKKK WSAR KIOA WRGA. My antenna is a 170' "L" with 120' E/W, and 50' N/S connected at the East end of the E/W. I have also logged about 61 beacons, but have reported none. My farthest is SF-412, Isle of Pines, Cuba. Don't even have 100 stations verified out of some 475 logged, but through the years hope to get most of them. Have reported 132, with KLCN-910 giving me a great deal of trouble. Have sent them three f/ups, but no reply. Tried for KBRV-540 on Jan. 5, but no go. Heard WTB-540 once at s/off, but haven't heard them again. In the house, my mind is usually on radio but outside it's all girls and drag racing. Wasn't racing, but wrecked my father's car on the night of Jan. 3, so have to go to Juvenile Court. NOTICE FROM THE F. C. C.

"The Canadian Administration has, for some time, been supplying the Commission with supplementary information regarding non-directional standard broadcast assignments in Canada. The information for each station is supplied on an individual sheet and includes a description of the antenna and ground system, the unattenuated field at one mile predicted for the system, and geographical coordinates descriptive of the location of the transmitter. Heretofore, this information has not been available for general distribution. However, by recent arrangement, copies of these description sheets already received, as well as those to be supplied in the future, will be available from the Goetz Company, 1030 20th Street, N.W., Washington 6, D.C. The Commission is advised that the 74 existing copies can be furnished, as a set, at a cost of \$11.10 (15 cents each), or that individual copies may be obtained at a cost of .20 cents each." Existing subscribers to the Goetz service will receive this set at a cost of \$7.40 (10¢ each)."

Dear Mr. (Marv) Robbins:

"You are probably unaware that Brochet is an isolated post in Northern Manitoba with no roads and no railway and the only access by canoe or aeroplane and on the latter depends our mail service. The lakes around here become unsafe for ski-equip aircraft around the end of June when the lakes are clear of ice and aircraft are able to land on the water. The foregoing is by way of explanation for the delay in writing.

"The station that has eluded your efforts at logging it for so long has not been on the air for at least two and possibly three years. CFEM is more c'est finis. The station was originally set up to pass the lonely hours away for the operators of the army signals station and also for the amusement of the few white people in this "Lonely outpost of Empire", however it (CFEM) fell into disuse and was finally dismantled... It is most unlikely that CFEM will be commissioned again and the studio is now used as a table tennis hall cum transient dormitory. I hope that you will accept my apologies and understand the reason for delay and as we only see the mail plane once or twice a month, if one is missed it's quite a while before the mail will go out.
