ON THE STATION'S STATIONERY - K F H - 1330 (In reply to Len Kruse's request for a 15 minute stand-by for the WICU-dx of 2/3/58) Dearlimr. Kruse:

"I am in receipt of your recent letter asking KFH to stand by for a 15 minute period on

Monday, February 3rd, from 3:30-3:45 a.m. CST.

"This is a very unusual request and one I would certainly like to acknowledge, knowing how much it must mean to you and the other Club members. I'm afraid that with previous commitments in this time period, as well as a definite service to our listeners, we will be unable to go along with you.

"Our Chief Engineer informs me that you should have no appreciable amount of interference from HTH, since we go directional at night, and favor WICU, also it's my thinking that if something big should break news-wise in the area, we would not be able to cover it. being off the air during this time period.

"Maybe sometime in the future something can be worked out."
