Sterling, PD, in early April.

Also from Stan cres: WSMN-1590 is ETing during the daytime with OC and occasional IDs so he suggests tratching for wee-hour tests from this brand new one in Nashua, H.H., with 5,000 watts, D-3.

Jamuary veries were DZBB FEB-810 HNA-908 KAHU KOBY 44Y KDAN HJKC KATT KUDU KOMO KRAI KFOD KIMI AFKN-560 KMTH KIPA WHIN, and so far in February, AFKN's on 1400 and 1250 and WHYN. Countries now, 39. Mentioned earlier about a TDE transmitter we have on board and a special DX on the BSB with it. Well, it puts out about 180 watts CV and only 30 watts on voice. Those are maximum powers, and must not be exceeded. However, the Mexican government does not insist that a station operate exactly at the assigned power. It must not operate beyond that assigned power, but may operate at a reduced power. Hope that clears the DIGEST on

listing of Mexican powers.

If you hear or verify of know of any information regarding a BCB station outside the US and Canada, the DIGEST is the place to share it with your friends.
