Very little DX here this week. 3/12- WNER-1250 on f/c 4:00-4:15 with band music, very weak here, but no sign of WEMP. Same morning, HJAD was way on top of CACB here, and report sent. 3/16- Disgusted by falling asleep while lying on the bed after getting in late and waiting for 5 a.m. to come so as to try for WIVI-1040, so I had to miss out on them, drat the luck (and the beer, hi). 3/17- WLEO-dx on 1170 was taken out by the Colombian here. Despite the handicaps, loggings keep on coming, like this: 2/10, tests from KTUT and KATT on 990, WOSC and WSYD 1300 and KHJ 930 RS. Nothing out of KLGA WLAS 2/9- KWFT-dx no go as CKCK too strong. Ex-member Dave Dary is now Hews Rirector there. Dave did KMAN tests a few years back. 2/8- Finally took a log on WMEX/4 as they topped WLAC @ 10 p.m. 2/11- Sick with the flu so sunset DX brought KVPI 1050 @ 7 s/off and a log on WIRL 1290 in case they change calls. 2/12, at last snagged KITE 930 7-7:30 s/off. Also got KFML 1390 and WATM 1590 on r/c. 2/16- Managed to rise for Sunday s/ons and headed for 1390 and WQIC. Instead KULP boomed in on top of WQIC at 7 s/on. KULP was most wanted Texamp. Might logging, KTRH 740. 2/17- CX peculiar, but KVOE 1400 boomed in, test from KTET and KPIN well received. WMLF bare logging and added WKAP and WHAY on for snowstorm. Noted but not needed were WELI WAYZ VILIS. WATR ID under WKAP. WEMP off this AM and also 2/24 so caught KGOL r/c but missed the s/pn of WETU. WIS 560 5:45 s/on logged. 2/22- KLFT 1600 RS s/off 5:45, 2/23- KENT 1550 RS 6:45, and WACO 1460 7 p.m. RS. 2/24- WFLO 870 r/c. (This station was omitted in Tests from KBBB and WCWC 1600 logged, and KRIO KECK and CFCY all logged. Weyrich Log). WLCS bothered KRIO. Hope I got enough on CFCY. Ens. Peter V. Taylor - USCGC Winnebago, WPG-40 - c/o F.P.O., San Francisco, Calif. Here wer are at scenic Midway. A little reception since we left Honolulu warch 1st. Scooter, you should have your KPOA verie by now. To those of you who have received their cards, they now send out letters with attractive letterhead. I am waiting until they get on 350 before I verify them. The two receivers which I have used for DRing are out of whack now. One, a Stewart-Warner AN/SRD-7 Radio Direction Finder, Las shorted out. The other, an RCA RBC, is shot because its antenna is so close to that of out 750 watt beacon. When the new beacon was tested (391 kc/s.) it arced over. So the little which has been done was done on the Ward Room RBO receiver. All times, EST. KCHJ-1010 mentioning DXers on March 3rd, 2:40 a.m. WXLG-1220 not using call, but just AFRS instead, 4:30-5:05. With the DX season swinging into the home stretch once again, a few words of thanks to the various hard working members of the NRC is in order, all the way from the Publisher who has sent the DX NEWS on its way so regularly all season, the various Elitors who spent long hours making up the stencils, the wonderfully successful CPC and those members who have contributed such things like the f/c list, CP lists, etc. and last but by no means least, the members whose steady flow of tips to the Editors, all add up to the best DX fan organization in the world. I can only heartily second the sentiments expressed by Hank Wilkinson in the 3/8 issue. The ET seems to be a disappearing part of broadcasting, so many new stations go on the air with few, or no early morning tests. This fact, with the near "curtain" of ANs on all but Monday morning, makes it more and more difficult to log new calls by nearing ETs, especially if your listening time is limited, as mine was during most of the present season. As a result, well over half of my new loggings have been made from DX Specials or f/cs and tips in DX MEWS. At \$4.00 membership is one of the best buys of the times. WESR signed on at 6:30 for a third new call. Then WMOR took them all out at 6:45, so we moved to 1280 totry for WDNT at 6:50. After failing three times, this time he made it poorly. Then to 1390 to try the EQIC Sunday s/on at 7:00. No luck, only WLAN, but after waiting ten minutes, in came WQIC coming on a little late. JAC --- Very sorry to have lot the DIGEST slide, just seem to put off until tomorrow, and consequently get nothing donc. Have had a long siege with little or no DX, then this week Kive been hitting the dials fairly fast and furious with several reports and follow-ups out this week. A reorganization of my log indicates that I have positively logged and identified 119 stations in 42 countries, reported to 92 in 38, and received verifications from 61 stations in 33 countries. The unreported countries all without enough for a verification have been Ukrains (They'r easy, though with Lvov (935), and Ouchgorod (890) regulars), Russian S. F. S. R. (Brief log on Kaliningrad 1142 on top for a couple of minutes), Latvia (Madona (1349) under French synchronized network), and Norther Iroland (1152) as I've been waiting for an opportunity to log the North Iroland home service. Reported but not verified are Moldavia, Lithuania, Albania, Vatican, and Sardinia, but latter only out today. GENER.L
