If anyone thinks that DXing is a cinch in Chicago he's mistaken, it's a touch-and-go proposition, you really have to have a good poir of ears to senatate electrical and station QRM. Plus certain power house stations, etc. The TPs listed in last week's bulletin have been quite regular since. Everything also is usually dead except CKBI CJVI-dx WSAU WATN through WEDC WKXL WNAF WSAJ using the cagetype Zeppe Antenna through WGOV KSWI WKOP KPDR KLEE, barely audible through WIP's powerhouse, WABZ WLCS KNET KFOX through WDSU with v/c also, WHAW KRAM KTW was a powerhouse on DX, floating right through WMAW, Milwaukee.
