Well, gang, this is it. Final report for a good long time. Very little DX to report despite continued activity at the dials. Static has been at a minimum during April and I sent out some 16 reports since last DX NEWS which came to a total of 50 reports for April. This is not too bad since usually static kills off all April DX here. May and June are always bad months when reports drop down to a mere trickle. As Lefty says, late summer DX is sometimes better than winter and I agree, having gotten some of my best catches in July and August. Stayed tuned until 6:00 and heard WEER in Warrenton Va. s/on but no report obtained. Also heard s/on at 6 was WFBB, WPTW and several others but all are verified. WEER s/on at 5:50 a.m. The next night logged KMRS to 8:15 s/off. 4/18 brought KLTR 1580 s/off 7 p.m. WEZL 1590 in Richmond, Va. on ET 1:50-2:03 s/off. 4/19- WCOY f/c to 1:13 s/off and WCCP RS to 2:00. 4/20- WDEH 800 6:30 RS and WJAK 1460 7 a.m. RS. Absolutely no new additions since. Sent reports to WSAI 1360, WCOC and KCBC just to do something. 4/27, I thought I had WOSH 1490 long enough to get a report on but no such luck as WOPA ruined them. And that is about the last Wisconsin station I need in my collection, Roy! Only eight more Wisconsin veries needed. Stations recorded are: Norfolk Island, AFRS Kwajelein, 3DB, JOQF, Okinawa, DYSS, SZIM, KOSI, 4BC, WVUV, KDUZ, KLAS, KWEL, KHFH, KBBB, KRAC, WCWC, KHIT, CKDA, KBBC, KVOE, WTAW, KWFR, KPIN, WGBC, WFER, WBIG, WFGV, WROK, then some Maori language to help anyone to identify it, and finally KFQD at sign-off. Recent loggings are Radio Ohakea, this station was only on for New Zealand airforce Day and was 50 watts on 1460 Kcs. It was a tough logging during daylight about 1000 miles north of here. KTSI (1380) off at 0130; WTRU, WESY on equipment test 2 AM 5th April 1580 Kcs, 1460 KADY TT 2/23 AM 3rd April. Thailand on 900 and 1430 where there is a Chinese outlet. Was fortunate enough to win one of KFI's cigarette lighters, but it has not yet reached here. (KM)

CMS sends in a note that he logged XERC (790) at 0300; noted KXOK (630) new ANer, and a hetrodyne on 690 at 0335 probably from an LA ANer not identified. This was for the Set Listening Period for April 2nd. When the material gets a bit lighter we will go into more details on the use of Set Listening Periods before we try to set them up.

It has come to our attention that many of you members have heard through rumors that dissension was prevailing to great heights among the NRC Officers. Without actually knowing the full facts I can realize where dissension might be the proper term. However with the full knowledge at hand I believe the proper term would be a difference of interpretation of an NRC By-Law, namely Article 1.

At the 1957 annual NRC Convention held in Ponca City, there were only 5 members of the Board Present. Many items were discussed and one of them was the deletion of DX Down The Dial because it seemed that this column was not worth its while mainly because it lacked the real purpose for which it had been instituted, that is for the really hot & important tips that would be helpful to the members, items that had they been stuck away in a regular musings report might have been passed over. However no Editor should be held responsible because such items are not received by him, this part is strictly up to the entire membership which I am sure could furnish such very useful data and information. Utilities Unlimited was also discussed at length by the 5 Board members attending the convention. The result was that after the convention the entire Board members were contacted in regard to deletion of DX Down The Dial. This motion was defeated but the majority of the Board members commented in regard to dropping Utilities Unlimited. The result was that your Board Chairman wrote the editor of DX Down the Dial informing him of the comment on Utilities Unlimited and pointed out that this was in violation of Article 1 because it dealt with frequencies outside the broadcast band as outlined in Article 1 (535-1605 kcs) and to delete that part of his column. The editor did not reply but instead published an item entitled "Utilities Unlimited Deletion???".

This prompted me to contact your Board Chairman with definite items to be presented to the Board for their action. The result was the cause for your President and Executive Secretary in the taking over the governing of the NRC temporarily after the submitted resignations of your Board Chairman and Vice Chairman. Both were then informed that their resignations would not be acted upon until later. During the time your President and Exec Sec governed the Club very much correspondence was going back and forth trying to clear up and bring about an understanding of the entire situation. Finally on April 5 1958 the governing of the NRC was turned back to the original Board of Directors under a temporary set up until a new set of By-Laws can be drawn up, or the present ones revised and adopted. Under the present temporary set up the governing of the club has been placed in 2 sections. First an Executive branch and Second an Legislative branch. This temporary plan was approved by the Board, by the necessary majority.

It had been hoped that in the May 1958 issue a complete release to you members would be published. After much discussion between your President and Executive Secretary the above was not done for the following reasons. First, It would consume just too much typing in order to give you all the information and data that would be necessary to give you everything necessary in order to clearly understand everything that had taken place. Further it could be said that we omitted things in order to make our doings look good along with hurting those effected. Further Wagner has his outside work to get finished and it has to be done at present in order to insure him of some re-embursement later.

This brought about the following solution. All information & data pertaining to what has transpired will be on hand at the annual 1958 NRC convention at Findlay and will be open for inspection to any member interested. It is hoped that a general meeting can be had as it is believed that a big majority of Board Members will be present along with a goodly number of you members. Both Wagner and myself will gladly answer anything put to us and both of us gladly will account for any actions we took and will assume full responsibility for them. (turn over)

If in the meantime any of you have your doubts as to the future of the NRC I can assure each and every one of you that your Club will continue to function in the future as it has in the long past.

You might note that despite the differences on interpretation your DX News has been published on time and in the same format. This policy will continue in the future, thanks to those members who are actually doing club work without any pay. All of them have been and are big enough to realize that getting DX News to you members is our most important job. It is also realized that the big majority of the membership are a lot more interested in receiving their copy of DX News on time rather than to worry much about anything else. However it always has been and will continue to be the policy of the NRC Officers to inform the membership of important things that take place.

It will be admitted that in the past, yes the long past that at times this information was not published. In some cases it has just been a case of laxity on the part of those responsible to get this information published, not that it was done ~~with~~ deliberately but in the vast majority of cases it was just been too busy with other things that have to be done and then other cases where the person responsible was just too busy with his regular job which we must all agree comes before anything else. A non-paying Club Office doesn't put food on the table.

It might interest the members that in the past the person elected as Board Chairman was put into what you might call a Hot Seat. Each time an item was brought to him to be placed before the entire Board it meant the typing or writing to each of the other 10 Board Members. The Board Chairman had to retain a copy for himself, making a total of 11 copies of all communications. This required at least typing the correspondence twice, making an original and 5 copies in one typing and an original and 4 copies the 2nd typing. In some cases the typewriter used was not so good and 3 typings had to be made in order to get the copies readable. So you can realize the great amount of work involved in each and every item that was presented to the entire Board. Further the Board Chairman had to give what he felt was full information and still at times some of the Board members felt that not enough information was given, which of course meant more typing. This is the main reason for believing something can be done in either a new or revised set of By-Laws.

At times in the past when a good majority of Board Members would be in attendance at one of the annual conventions much of the necessary club business could be taken care of at the Board Meeting. But as we all know there are times when a majority of the Board members cannot attend a convention and it is at these times when we must sit down and do a lot of typing. Past experience at these Board meetings has shown that so much more can be accomplished when a majority of the Board can sit down and meet personally and it is hoped that at Findlay this situation will again occur.

In closing for this time I would like to remark on rumors that your President and Exec Sec are too tough. Maybe we are, but let me say, Strict would be a better word. I have never obstructed anything that I felt was for the benefit of the majority of the club, BUT I did and always will ~~to~~ obstruct anything, regardless, so long as it is not presented to the Board for their action as outlined in the NRC By-Laws, I will insist that before any changes are made in the format of the NRC such change will be properly presented to the Board for their action and that all will abide by their decision.
