For those DXers interested in hearing Ken Mackey's tape of stations in Japan, Alaska, several Pacific Islands and quite a few U.S.A. low-powered stations just let me know. I believe, however, that in certain areas the tape could be heard by groups and of course this would speed up the "merry-go-round" so that all the members could get a chance to hear it. By the way, the mailman stopped by last Monday with two veries. One was from "Radio Jamaica" 1180 kc/s. on a report of March 16, 1958, and #2 was from "Radio Phongsang" 785 kc/s. on reports of October 7 and November 4, 1957. These two brought my "Countries Verified" up to 40. I still have about eight reports out but there isn't too much time left. Quite a few are South Americans and I wonder about them due to the fracas in several of the countries where Vice-President Nixon visited. All radio stations have political views, of course, but I hope that this doesn't interfere with our hobby. Even with the cross section of opinions in Europe and Asia we do rather well with replies from radio stations. That brings me up to the visit from John Callarman on Tuesday, June 3rd. We were able to squeeze in about four hours (due to my working a second shift) and it was a great pleasure talking foreign DX, my favorite subject. He has a fine collection of European and Asia-Minor stations. TT atop WKY on 930, 2:20, no voice yet at 2:50 and to bed. 5/17- TT drove me mad, 800, 1:30 to after 2:10. 980 at 2:17, 1360 at 2:24, 1430 atop WIL at 2:40. 5/18- TT atop WAKR, 1590, 1:25 to 1:47 and silent with no voice. 690 had one fading in and out badly, 1:50 to after 2:10 but never caught a call. June 1 - Veries in since last musing have been from APL APP HUKX KIRO ZNT 4QL KOLA KERG and 3XY. This brings it up to 43 countries. For all practical purposes another DX season has drawn to a close, with again, hats off to the NRC for a job well done. Lefty has continued keeping the DX NEWS lively and entertaining as well as informative, and at the same time, his constant pleas for more reports have apparently netted results. Cousin Fred V.V. has kept the foreign section really hot. Ben patch's f/c list corrections have kept it up to date; and the CPC has provided some rather welcome catches for some of us. Reports were sent to 33 Australian stations and six New Zealanders, so am hopefully awaiting these. Also China and U.S.S.R. were reported, along with Johnson Island. So for the next two months I'll just sit back and record them as they come in. There have been occasional comments concerning DXing from one single location. This is certainly fair, competition wise. I have been fortunate in being able to go to Europe and out here in the Pacific, and have DXed accordingly, which seems sensible enough. Six countries were verified while I was in Europe; two of these have been reverified from Stateside, along with five more, Bermuda, New Zealand and Hawaii were also verified stateside. Eyeballing Hank Tyndall's and Stan Stanbury's remarkable achievements, I think that a lot of countries are still available. Those of us who have DXed since say 1950 have not had the advantage of watching radio grow up, or of the practically annihilated clear channel. A hearty HELLO to the 65 prospective members who are seeing the DX NEWS for the first time. We hope you like it. The footnote in Popular Electronics was misleading in stating the NRC covers the broadcast band part of shortwave listening. Actually, the NRC is broadcast band only, 535-1605 kilocycles. Actually, there is more real DX in these kilocycles than in all the shortwave bands, at least, that is how I feel. If you want domestic stations only, there are in the neighborhood of 3000 in the U.S. and Canada. If you want foreign DX, again you have a choice of countries, and as a look at the opposite side of this page will show you, the number of countries verified by our members would make a good many shortwave listeners envious. Naturally, DX NEWS and the NRC are instrumental in furnishing tips for the members to reach the totals shown. If the abbreviations puzzle you, a page showing them is sent to each new member, along with a frequency check list, articles that have been published in the past year, conditions of the frequencies list, construction permits, etc.

The postal increase going into effect should not effect the Club too much. Our main mailing rates will stay the same. It will effect those of you having your bulletins sent first class mail as it will now cost you two cents additional each issue. On the average that is, when the bulletin goes over 10 pages it will cost an additional 3 cents. It will effect the club directly in mailing out bulletins to DXing stations, etc. as in these cases the Club pays the postage, and they go first class or air mail.

How does it go "Imitation is the sincerest form***". HI.
